December Greetings!

With the holidays on the way we are looking forward to some fun Auxiliary events. At this time of year, it is always our goal to help others and of course our Veterans and their families. At our November meeting our members were busy stuffing! Not turkeys but neck pillows for the VA Hospital!! The material and stuffing was donated by Diane Pickett, one of our Auxiliary members and the pillows were sewn by Jolinda Michels. Before our meeting our members stuffed the neck pillows. The pillows will be taken to the VA and given to patients in need of comfort. Thank you to all that helped with that project!

It was great to see so many members and new members at that meeting. 30 Auxiliary members were at our November meeting! That was fantastic and we hope to continue increasing our membership in the following months. Annika Johnson our Girls State participate from Park Christian School spoke about her experience going to Girls State. It sounded like it was a wonderful experience for her.

We voted to increase the membership dues next July for the year 2027 from \$35.00 to \$40.00 per year. This will give us some extra funds to use for helping Veterans. Here is a breakdown of the dues for 2025-2026. \$18.00 goes to the National organization and \$12.00 goes to Minnesota. The \$12.00 will increase to \$18.00 in 2027 with increases in the following areas but we don't have the breakdown yet:

American Legion Family Hospital Association-\$0.25 Department National Leadership Fund-\$0.20

Department Junior Conference Fund- \$0.10

Auxiliary program support and Department staff expenses-\$11.45

With your dues you get a paid subscription to the American Legion Auxiliary magazine and a paid subscription to the Legionnaire. I hope this isn't too confusing!!!

The 2025-2026 American Legion Department of Minnesota President's project is the Honor Flight. There are 6 hubs that support Minnesota counties and the Lone Eagle program that serves Veterans not served by a hub. President Robin Dorf hopes to raise \$35,000 to split evenly between the 7 hubs giving each hub \$5,000!! If her goal is reached that means our own hub of Honor Flight of ND/MN, of which many of our own members are involved in volunteering, will receive from her generous and thoughtful project to have our Veteran's go on a trip of a lifetime!

Coming up on December 1st we have our unit meeting. It will be a potluck and ugly sweater night!!! The meeting starts at 6:00 with an Executive meeting at 5:30. Bring a dish to share. It should be a fun night so make your calendars!! December 13th we are planning to go to the Fargo National Cemetery to lay wreaths on the graves with Wreaths Across America. More on that at our meeting. December 14th is the Veterans Family Christmas Party with the VFW Auxiliary it is from 2:00-6:00 with set up at 12:30 at Midtown Tavern. UNIT 21 AUXILIARY MEMBERSHIP



The MN HIGH SCHOOL CLAY TARGET LEAGUE has completed the 2025 season. As usual, the fall season numbers were down. There were about 50 CO-ED youth shooters. The MN. State shoot is in the spring, so this is it for 2025. It is now time to thank all the great volunteers involved. The parents and Grandparents who get their youth into this shooting sport. We also should be proud that Post 21 helps make this possible with our financial support.

With the fall, and the start of school we now turn to another shooting sport. For the CO-ED high school sport, is now Archery is now the name of the game. Your Post 21 financially supports local archery. The one we have supported for years is Lake Agassiz Bowmen. At one time we supported their Archery Education Program. It was JOAD, (Junior Olympic Archery Development). We supported this for years. The Fargo School System has taken over the archery education programs. They, like Moorhead School, have now taken over archery education for CO-ED youth.

Both ND and MN schools now teach the NASP program nationwide. NASP means (NATIONAL ARCHERY SCHOOL PROGRAM) This program is CO-ED, Olympic style targets, no shooting sights at 20 yards. I will get more information about this program in the future.

Your Post 21 still supports the Lake Agassiz Bowmen archery club. As they no longer do the JOAD archery education, we now support them with a 3-D target for their annual archery shoot. That is for their CO-ED cub shooters. The Cub shooters are ages 5-10Yr olds. These cubs just start to shoot archery.

FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, through 31 OCTOBER 2025.

There are 328 urns in the Columbarium, 679 urns in the ground, 31 caskets in the private vaults, 301 caskets in the Government vaults and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,341.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, INCLUDE 1,055 VETERANS AND 286 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,341. THERE ARE 158 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE break down per branch of service is: Army – 533, Navy –224, US Marine Corps – 70, US Air Force – 224, Army/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 286, for a total of 1,341 Internments/burial.

During the month of October, the Fargo memorial Honor Guard conducted 16 Interment/
Burials for 206volnteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557, 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 2,799. Since 13 October 2019 thru 31 October 2025, we have accumulated 17,961 donated volunteer hours.


