THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 29 February 2024.

WHAT DO YOU GET WHEN YOU CROSS AN INSECT WITH AN EASTER BUNNY?

There are 213 urns in the Columbarium, 476 urns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 210 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 926 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 734 VETERANS AND 192 SPOUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 926. AND THERE ARE 98 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERIES. WE HAD 11 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS FOR JANUARY AND 9 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS FOR FEBRUARY 2024.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 384, Navy – 151, 1 US Marine Corps – 51, US Air Force -144, ARMY/AF – 4, Spouses – 192, for a total of 926 internments/burials.

Our yearly volunteer hours are – 2019 - 966, 2020 - 2,072, 2021 - 3,373, 20222 - 2,798, 2023 - 2,557 – 2024 - 252. From 13 October 2019 to 29 February 2024, we have accumulated 12,018 donated volunteer hours.

Shooting Sports

This month, it's on the Post 21 support of the USA Clay Target League. The kids have been getting ready and waiting for the Spring season, weather permitting. It looks like it won't be very long before the clay targets will be flying.

At this time, the Head coach will be getting his shooters registered. This will involve such things as the required age, whether a guardian or parent registers the Shooter, and whether they have the League-approved Firearm Safety Certifications and agree to the League's rules, policies, and procedures. The coach will then register his School team with the League.

In addition, the Head Coach will gather his team staff. He must have a minimum of one assistant Coach for every ten team shooters. These coaches will also supervise five shooters on the shooting line. There must also be a Range Safety Officer (RSO) who will supervise safe shooting activities and range operations.

A Range Officer must be present at no more than two adjoining shooting pits at all times. The head coach will also have volunteers to help out, usually a parent or Grandparent. As you can see, the head coach is a very busy person and a volunteer.

When the season starts, come out and watch these kids participate in the Shooting Sports.

3-year American Legion Membership is now available, even if you have already renewed for 2024! This is exciting and GREAT news and can be a big money saver...

Dues will be increasing (if you haven't heard, \$5 for National, \$3 for Department, and \$1 for the 9th District for the 2025 year, and if you get on to this NOW, you could see savings of \$9.00 a year (or a total of \$27.00 for the 3 years).

If you renewed for the 2024 American Legion membership year prior to the new multiyear membership rollout on Dec. 4, you can now take advantage of a three-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year.

Visit legion.org/renew for the multiyear membership for 2025, 2026, and 2027.

Legionnaires still needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining the organization for the first time can also lock in a three-year membership (2024, 2025, and 2026) by visiting legion.org/renew or legion.org/join.

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the National American Legion website (legion.org/renew and legion.org/join). Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.

- Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.

- There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.

- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.

- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.

Happy Easter,

I hope everyone had a safe and happy Easter. There's a couple of items that I would like to bring to your attention. One is for Minnesota veterans called the Post 9/11 Veteran Service Bonus. The other is opening VA healthcare to over one million veterans nationwide that were exposed to toxins and air pollutants. Please call myself or Curt for any eligibility questions. We also want to thank all Vietnam veterans for their service, as March 29th is National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

The Post-9/11 Veteran Service Bonus

The Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) has a long history of awarding service bonuses to Minnesota Veterans who served in America's wars. Starting in 1919 after World War I, through World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Persian Gulf War, and now the Global War on Terrorism. MDVA recognizes the sacrifices and courage Minnesotans took to defend our country.

The 2022 Legislature passed, and Governor Walz signed the first-ever Veterans Omnibus Bill that included funding for a service bonus payable to eligible Veterans who served from 9/11/01 to 8/30/21. MDVA is honored to facilitate this program for eligible Veterans currently serving service members or Veterans' beneficiaries.

The 2023 Legislative Session resulted in several changes that expanded Minnesota Veteran eligibility for the Post-9/11 Service Bonus. Newly eligible Veterans now include:

Veterans who did not enlist/begin their service in Minnesota. Recipients of the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal may now receive the full bonus allotment. Veterans who were previously denied the bonus or are now eligible for a larger bonus can reapply based on the changes that were made this session.

MDVA began processing payments the week of July 25th, 2022. Applicants can expect their mailed check approximately 12 weeks after approval.

The application opened July 7th, 2022, and will run until June 30th, 2024, or until funds have been exhausted.

March 29th was National Vietnam War Veterans Day because on March 29th, 1973, Military Assistance Command, Vietnam (MACV) was disbanded, and the last U.S. combat troops departed the Republic of Vietnam. President Barack Obama signed a presidential proclamation in 2012, designating March 29th as the annual observance of Vietnam War Veterans Day. The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act, signed into law in 2017, also designates March 29th of each year as National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

VA Health Care Enrollment

In one of the largest-ever expansions of Veteran health care, all Veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards during military service – at home or abroad – will be eligible for VA health care beginning March 5th, 2024.

At the direction of President Biden, the VA is expanding health care eligibility to millions of Veterans – including all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11 – years earlier than called for by the PACT Act. Veterans who were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving in the military – at home or abroad – will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care beginning March 5th, 2024. This means that all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11 will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care beginning March 5th, 2024. This means that all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11 will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for VA benefits. Additionally, Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty in the United States will also be eligible to enroll. Additionally, VA health care is often more affordable than non-VA health care for Veterans.

VA encourages all eligible Veterans to visit VA.gov/PACT or call 1-800-MYVA411 to learn more and apply for VA health care beginning March 5th. Since President Biden signed the PACT Act into law on August 10th, 2022, more than 500,000 Veterans have enrolled in VA health care.

"If you're a Veteran who may have been exposed to toxins or hazards while serving our country, at home or abroad, we want you to come to us for the health care you deserve," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "VA is proven to be the best, most affordable health care in America for Veterans – and once you're in, you have access for life. So don't wait; enroll starting March 5th."

"Beginning March 5th, we're making millions of Veterans eligible for VA health care years earlier than called for by the PACT Act," said VA Under Secretary for Health Shereef Elnahal, M.D. "With this expansion, the VA can care for all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11. We can also care for Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty here at home – by working with chemicals, pesticides, lead, asbestos, certain paints, nuclear weapons, x-rays, and more. We want to bring all of these Veterans to VA for the care they've earned and deserve."

This expansion of care covers Vietnam Veterans, Gulf War Veterans, Iraq War Veterans, Afghanistan War Veterans, and Veterans who deployed in support of contingency operations for the Global War on Terror (Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Freedom's Sentinel, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Operation Inherent Resolve, and Resolute Support Mission), and more.
