We had a successful 2nd to the last breakfast at beginning of March. Now only 1 left until fall. April 12th. So please mark your calendars!!!

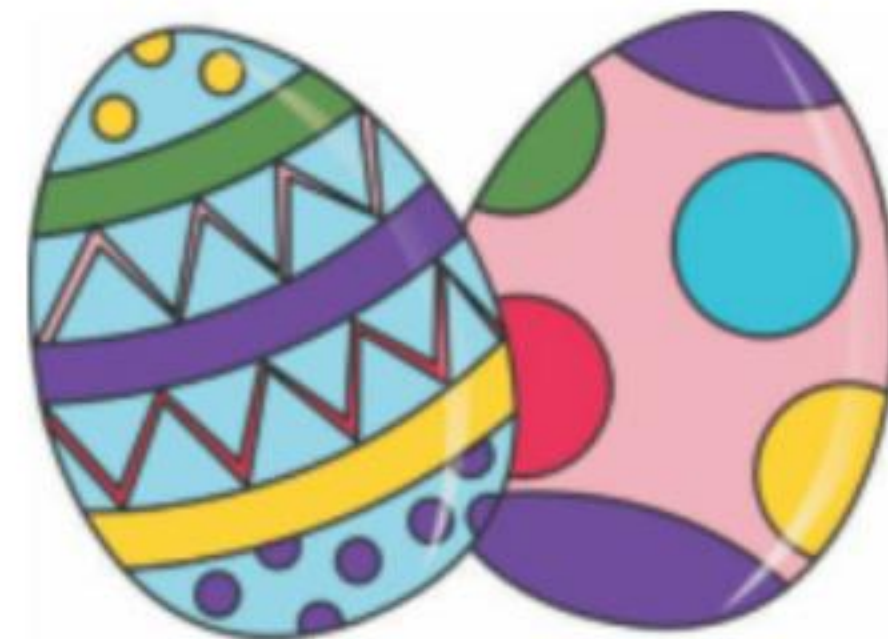
We were happy and proud to participate in our Legion Birthday and Membership dinner.

FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY

April 2026



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, thru 29 February 2026.

There are 339 urns in the Columbarium, 689 urns in the ground, 31 caskets in the private vaults, 320 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,381.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY INCLUDE 1,086 VETERANS AND 295 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,381. THERE ARE 159 COUPLES INTERED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

The breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 553, Navy – 230, US Marine Corps – 73, US Air Force – 226, Army/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 295, for a total of 1,381 Internments/burials.

During the month of FEBRUARY, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 11 Interments/Burials for 12 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021=3,373, 2022=2,798, 2023=2,557, 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 2,977, 2026 = 98. Since 13 October 2019 thru 29 FEBRUARY 2026, we have accumulated 17,732, donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Honor Flight Network expands flights to Desert Storm Era Veterans

The (National) Honor Flight Network is proud to announce expansion to Gulf War / Operation Desert Storm era Veterans who served through July 31, 1991 (based on Veterans Affairs established dates). The Desert Shield and Desert Storm Memorial – honoring more than 600,000 service members who deployed to help liberate Kuwait in 1991 – will be dedicated this fall. Beginning in the 2027 flying season, Hubs can begin bringing Veterans who served between December 7, 1941, and July 31, 1991. PLEASE NOTE: The Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN will not be accepting applications at this time. Due to the high number of Veterans currently on our waiting list, the Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN will not yet be accepting applications from Veterans of Operation Desert Storm or the Gulf War era. At this time, our priority remains serving the Veterans of World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War to ensure the oldest and most medically fragile Veterans can experience their honor flight first. When the Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN is ready to begin accepting applications from Veterans who served during Operation Desert Storm and the Gulf War era, we will release another announcement to notify the public and ensure those Veterans can apply for a future honor flight. <https://veteranshonorflightofndmn.org/veterans-application> - Board of Directors

Cass County Veteran Service Office awarded VOW Grant

On behalf of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) and the DAR Service for Veterans Committee, it is my great pleasure to inform you that Cass County Veterans Service Office has been awarded a \$5, 000 Vivian's Outreach to Women (VOW) Grant. The VOW Grant is awarded annually to qualified 501(c)(3) shelters or organizations that support homeless or indigent women veterans. The grant is made possible through an endowment established by DAR member Vivian Schaffer and is administered by the National DAR Service for Veterans Committee. These funds will support Cass County Veterans Service Office in offering timely, confidential, and judgment-free assistance that promotes self-sufficiency and dignity to female veterans. Each interaction will also serve as a bridge to connect female veterans to additional resources, including VA healthcare, mental health services, earned benefits, community programs, and long-term support systems. By removing small but impactful barriers-such as the cost of hygiene products, gas to attend medical appointments, or groceries during a time of hardship-this initiative will help female veterans stabilize their daily lives, reduce stress, and improve overall well-being.

Avoiding Mixing Legion Attire and Political Caucuses

Attending a political caucus is an important civic responsibility. It is a place where citizens gather as individuals to discuss issues, select candidates and shape the direction of their communities.

For members of The American Legion, participation in this process reflects a long-standing commitment to civic engagement and the democratic principles they have defended through service. However, it is equally important to recognize the distinction between personal political activity and representation of the organization — especially when it comes to wearing Legion attire at a caucus.

The American Legion is a nonpartisan organization. Wearing Legion attire — such as caps, uniforms or branded clothing — at a political caucus can unintentionally blur that line. It may give the impression that the organization itself is endorsing a particular candidate, party or political position, even when that is not the case.

This perception matters. The Legion's credibility depends on its neutrality in partisan politics. While the organization advocates strongly on issues affecting veterans, national security and Americanism, it does not align itself with political parties or candidates. Maintaining that neutrality ensures that the Legion remains a respected voice across the political spectrum and can effectively work with elected officials of all affiliations.

The solution is simple and respectful: attend caucuses and other partisan political events in plain clothing. Engage, speak, vote and advocate as an individual. Then, when participating in Legion functions or community service activities, wear Legion attire with pride and purpose, representing the organization in the way it was intended.

In doing so, members honor both their rights as citizens and their responsibilities as Legionnaires. They uphold the nonpartisan values that make the American Legion strong, ensuring it continues to serve veterans and communities with integrity and unity for generations to come.
