Moorhead American Legion Gaming Tidbits


July 20th, 2024



FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON SEPTEMBER 7, 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from October 13, 2019, Thru JUNE 31, 2024.

WHY DOES THE EASTER BUNNY HAVE A SHINY NOSE?

There are 234 urns in the Columbarium, 520 Urns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 224 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,005 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 801 VETERANS AND 204 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,005. THERE ARE 114 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army 417, Navy – 158, 1 US Marine Corps – 64, US Air Force -158, ARMY/AF-4, Spouses – 204, for a total of 1,005 internments/burial.

Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 20222 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,592 - 2024 = 252. Since October 13, 2019, Thru JUNE 30, 2024, we have accumulated 13,084 donated volunteer hours.

It is with humility and a degree of pride that Tom Linnertz told Marvin Nicklay that as of July 23, 2024, Tom has enjoyed the honor of playing more than 1022 Sounding of Taps.

Tom started playing Taps when he learned that funeral homes were using recordings and what he called "Fake" Taps which he considers as failing the promise made to all service persons. The promise as he remembers it is: "When my Drill Instructor told me how much he cared about me ("Not"), that he would ensure when I died (most likely in combat because of my stupidity), the military would provide a burial and military honors. At the time I started playing Taps, the military was NOT providing honors. The Legion, VFW and other Veterans Organizations were providing this honor as volunteers.

Tom is pleased now that military honors with a military flag presentation are now taking place. Tom now plays Taps with the Moorhead Legion and at the Fargo National Cemetery as often as he can. At times, he spends an entire day playing Taps at different locations. On his own and as a member of the Legion and Bugles Across America, he has played Taps as far west as Lewistown, Montana, and as far east as Syracuse, New York. He states he will continue to play as long as he can and whenever possible.

In closing, Tom states that everyone should consider joining the Honor Guard; it not only honors those who have gone before us but also helps you become even more proud of your service-building camaraderie.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILLNEVER cancel a Veteran's internment because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Hello, the Summer is moving fast and please consider these events in the upcoming months. (See attached) The Fargo VA, Clay County Veteran Services, and Cass County Veterans Services are planning a veteran stand down for all veterans to sign up for VA healthcare, claim assistance, and a free meal plus many other area veteran-specific service providers on 9/11 L/24, from 1000-1500 at the downtown. Broadway Square. More details to come.

The VA has expanded care to more than 3.5 million post 9/11 veterans since 2022, and they're campaigning to add 1 million more veterans nationwide to their healthcare system. Please come see Curt or me for more information and to see if you're eligible for the PACT Act expansion. It has added 23 conditions to VA's presumption list for toxic exposure. Provides toxic exposure screenings to all veterans at VA medical appointments and boosts training and education for VA personnel on illnesses connected to toxins on or after August 2, 1990. Has establishes 31 new VA facilities and invests in VA claims processing. Has expanded the list of locations with presumed exposure to Agent Orange to include Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, Guam, American Samoa, and Johnston Atoll, covering Vietnam War-era service in most instances and extending past the war's end for some locations. Has required a series of research projects, studies, and surveys tracking toxic exposure-related healthcare concerns, ranging from cancer rates to mental health issues to overall VA treatment.

Please consider donating to the Cass and Clay GAP fund if you're looking for a cause where all proceeds go directly to a local veteran. This fund assists veterans with support outside of the scope of our federal partners. ID cards, tires for a vehicle, rent, deposits, and moving are just some of those items that the fund can assist veterans with a need.




