





### **Veterans Service Officer**

Hi,

I was recently in Louisville, KY, for an accreditation training, and many things that the VA is doing works, but unfortunately, veterans in Cass/Clay County are scared. Many of you have voiced your concerns, and they're all valid. This is not about politics. It's about promises. When a veteran takes the oath, they're told they will be cared for when the uniform comes off. Legislation like this should be carefully reviewed to ensure it doesn't erode the very benefits that uphold that promise. We have earned benefits not given to us just because, but earned through hard work, perseverance, blood, sweat, and tears.

Buried in the details of new federal legislation are changes that could dramatically affect veterans access to health care, housing, and food security, especially those who are elderly, low-income, or disabled. Many veterans rely on Medicaid as a supplement to VA health care, especially when facing long-term care needs or medical services not offered at VA facilities. If Medicaid eligibility tightens, it could create barriers to vital care for the very individuals who once stood in defense of our nation. We can do better, and now is the time to pay attention. Demand answers and demand respect. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits could hit low-income veteran households hard — especially in rural areas where food deserts and lack of access already present challenges. We do work with several food banks in the F-M area. Because honoring our veterans means more than standing ovations at football games — it means standing up for them when it counts. If you're in need, please reach out to Curt or me for help.

Stand Down II Event – see attached flyer or save the date.

Cass and Clay County's mission remains clear: to ensure every veteran in our community receives the respect, resources, and guidance they deserve. With your support, we can continue expanding this impact and honoring the commitment these men and women have made to our country. Please attend our Stand Down on 9/11/25 at Broadway Square from 1000-1400.

Throughout the year, we also coordinate regular VA benefits workshops, claims clinics, and outreach efforts in collaboration with local partners. These events include healthcare enrollment opportunities, employment fairs, educational briefings on legislative updates, and targeted outreach to underserved populations, including rural and women veterans. We also offer peer support groups and appreciation events designed to strengthen connections and reduce social isolation.

Thanks to these efforts, we've seen a significant rise in successful claims outcomes, particularly for veterans who were previously denied or unaware of their eligibility. Our growing network of support continues to improve advocacy, build trust, and streamline access to essential benefits and services.

We would love to see you, and thanks for all you do!



# IRA - Individual Retirement Account QCD - Qualified Charitable Contribution

If you have an IRA and are 70½ or older, you can make a transfer from your IRA directly to a qualified charity using a QCD, and it will be tax-free. These transfers are a great way to give to a qualified charity, especially if you do not itemize deductions or file a tax return.

The amount is not reported as income and is not taken as an itemized deduction if you file a tax return. The amounts must be paid directly from your IRA to the qualified charity.

Our American Legion is a qualified charity. If you want to use this method to donate to our American Legion, contact the trustee of your IRA to arrange a direct payment to "American Legion Post 21".

Your holder (trustee) of your IRA or your tax preparer should be able to answer any other questions you have concerning a QCD.
