## THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internments/burials sat the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 31 DECEMBER 2023.

#### WHAT HAPPENS WHEN FROGS PARK ILLEGALLY?

There are 210 urns in the Columbarium, 467rns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 202 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 906 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 717 VETERANS AND 189 SPOUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 906. AND, THERE ARE 94 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 381, Navy – 148, US Marine Corps – 50, US Air Force -134, ARMYAF – 4, Spouses – 189 for a total of 906 internments/burial.

Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 20222 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557. Since 13 October 2019 thru 31 December 2023, we have accumulated 11,766 donated volunteer hours.

WHAT STARTED OUT TO BE AN UNCLAIMED VETERAN'S BURIAL HAD A HAPPY ENDING.

#### UNCLAIMED VETERAN - VERNON GUNTENKUNST - 11 DECEMBER 2023

One thing is that while volunteering as a member of the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard, it is always hard when we get word of another unclaimed veteran. Well, we are honored to provide services for all Veterans. When we have a Veteran who is "unclaimed," it holds a dear spot in all veterans' hearts.

We do our best to find the Families of these Veterans. One main thing that we've found is that some veterans have a friend or next of kin, or the phone number of that family member is no longer working. And then others, sometimes, just lose contact with family for their own

reasons. Whatever the reason, we, as Veterans, will not let our brothers and sisters in arms get laid to rest without their Military/Veterans families.

Our last unclaimed veteran, Veron Gutenkunst, had an outdated nextof-kin number for his brother, who lived in Minneapolis. With what information we had, we located his brother and sister. Unfortunately, his brother is in a health rehab hospital dealing with his own health complications and only was able to communicate through his nurse, and his sister is in Washington State and is elderly and unable to attend. She was grateful that we had located her and informed her about Vernon. She wanted his flag and empty shell casings to go to a local veteran's organization close to his hometown. Mott, ND, does not have a veteran's club.

While his biological family could not attend, we had many veterans, police, community members, and two people from his hometown in Mott. One was his childhood friend and neighbor, Leo Greff, who was



able to attend and help with the pallbearers, along with members of the Fargo Memorial honor guard.

Word was put out to Facebook, etc., and from there, it went viral. Also, we had support from the local radio and TV channels about the unclaimed veteran. We received over sixty phone calls from all over North Dakota and Minnesota, asking if we still needed Pallbearers. We received a phone call from Omaha, Neb., and one caller said he was from "Deep South" Texas. Both had seen the notice on a Web Page. The Fargo-Moorhead and surrounding areas have always been big supporters of attending unclaimed veterans' internments/burials.

#### THEY GET TOAD

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILL NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

# **Color/Honor Guard**

The Honor Guard had a nice break over the holidays. No funeral honors were performed between Dec 18th and January 6th, 2024. Since then, there have been two Honor Funerals: Forrest Elder, Navy, and Marvin Weispsenning, 1946 to 1949 Army, serving in the Philippines, Korea, and Japan.

The Color Guard had no activities that it was involved in. The final count for 2023 was 50 Funeral Honors performed and 10 Color Guard events completed.

The Honor/Color Guard still needs new members. Will Fisher celebrated his 92nd birthday recently and asked me if he could retire from the Honor/Color Guard. I advised him that I would keep him on for when the weather improves. He has been a go-to member for me since he lives so close to me, and he is honored to attend events. FM Legion Riders and Sons of the American Legion members are eligible to join us in this important duty of honoring our fellow veterans and comforting their survivors. At a full honors ceremony, the rifle detail has M1 Garand rifles that we use to fire three shots each before taps are played and the flag is folded and provided to the veteran's family.

# **Shooting Sports**

Our second Shooting Sport is the MN " State High School Clay Target League." Through this sport, we support the Glyndon Rod and Gun Club. Three area Schools have shooting teams that shoot at the GRG facility. They are Moorhead, Dilworth/Felton, and Park Christian schools. Approximately 100 CO/ED youth shoot the Spring and Fall sessions.

Your POST-21 support goes to support the School League shooting area and equipment. It could be one or all of the following: Shooting grounds, parts for the clay pigeon throwing machine, or shooting station speakers. It may be the upkeep of the CO/ED youth shooting area. Your Post-21 support is able to affect all three schools and their CO/ED youth shooting teams.

As in Archery shooting, SAFETY is a top priority. There has never been a serious injury in either shooting sport we support. Safety issues begin with safety education. In MN, all shooters must pass the MN Hunter Safety course before they can shoot in the MN High School League. All instructors are MN State Certified to teach the Hunter Safety Course.

The State of MN supports this shooting sport. The league is committed to the safety and protection of all participating youth. The head coaches and instructors are required to complete the CLASS CERTIFICATION class. The coaches and instructors always say there are three things to remember, SAFETY, SAFETY, SAFETY.

#### Greetings,

As the cold continues, let's try to remember our less fortunate. There are many drop-off points for hats, gloves, and cold-weather gear to be donated to veterans in need. Please contact Curt or me for more information. See attached. Have a safe rest of the month.

The Fargo Air Museum unveiled a new exhibit featuring the early years of the North Dakota Air National Guard. The exhibit features guard operations between 1947 and 1954. "While many around the world love the P-51 Mustang, many don't know that its service with the United States carried on after World War II, well into the 1950s, in fact. The Fargo Air Museum's newest exhibit explores a chapter of local history that many today don't know much about, and that is the presence of these iconic warbirds being based right here in Fargo," said Fargo Air Museum Collections Manager Max Sabin. "We would love to see the community come out to the Fargo Air Museum to learn more about the early days of the North Dakota Air National Guard and the men that made up that first group of airmen after World War II." You can see uniforms, artifacts, pictures, and stories from the first seven years of the North Dakota Air National Guard through the Korean War era and up to the unit's transition to jet fighter interceptors in 1954. Located on 19th Avenue North, just east of Interstate-29, the Fargo Air Museum is home to aircraft of all eras. Learn more at <u>fargoairmuseum.org</u>


