Remember, this meal includes a full salad bar, delicious bread, and sautéed mushrooms and onions, served with a baked potato. This is truly a delicious meal for a fantastic price. Come on out and enjoy!!

July 13th is the annual Steak Fry fundraiser for the Moorhead Blues/Golds baseball team. It starts at 4pm and ends at 8pm. You can buy tickets at the door on that day. The cost of the meal is \$20 per plate. There are also children's meal tickets available for \$10 (chicken strips and fries).

The end of July marks our major fundraiser for the Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN. This three-day event is filled with fantastic music, craft vendors, a dunk tank, axe throwing, a climbing wall, food vendors, Sandford Life Flight, and huge farm machinery from RDO, along with cranes from Wyson & Veritas Crane Services. FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since we began conducting internments and burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from October 13, 2019, through May 31, 2025.

There are 282 urns in the Columbarium, 613 urns in the ground, 30 caskets in the private vaults, 280 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial WALL, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,207. 247 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,207. THERE ARE 141 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 491, Navy –201, US Marine Corps – 65, US Air Force –199, Army/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 247, for a total of 1,207 internments/burials.

During the month of May, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 25 Internments/Burials, totaling 528 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557 and 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 924. Since October 13, 2019, through May 31, 2025, we have accumulated 16,086 donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will never cancel an Internment of a veteran due to bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Here are a few of our highlights...

- Mount Rushmore classic and beautiful
- Crazy Horse We did a van ride to the top, and that was pretty cool. Kids liked it more than I thought they would.
- Bear Country So fun! One of the highlights for sure. It was hot, so they weren't as active as they could be, but it's a cool place.
- Reptile Garden Lots of animals and large chunks of it are inside, so if the weather isn't great, it's still fun
- Custer State Park we did a Jeep tour with a guide, which was so awesome (Buffalo Safari Jeep Tour). We saw a ton of bison and other animals, and she had a lot of cool history, etc. You can also just go to the park, though, and drive around yourself. That would've been fun too. It's really big, I would think this could take a whole day if you want... there's a lot of stuff we didn't see that she mentioned, but we just didn't have time.
- The Mammoth Site historical and big displays of fossils
- Deadwood we stayed there the last night out there. Love Deadwood. We wandered around Deadwood for a while the next day. Lots to do in town (free shootout shows on Main Street, lots of shops and bars/and restaurants) hour plus from cabin.
- 1880 Train we did this from Hill City to Keystone and back, and it was a lot of fun too an old train ride that takes about 2 hours round trip
- Big Thunder Gold Mine this was the kids' favorite it was cool. You do a tour in a gold mine and then get to pan for gold and take it home.

Food stuff—we ate at Mt. Rushmore Brewing in Custer two nights in a row—the food was so good and they had cool live music. Then we went to this place called The Custer Beacon on Wednesday night and they had bingo, which the kids could play too (our kid won \$188) and good food/music/etc., outdoor games for the kids, it was fun! Get there early, though! Also in Custer, we ate at Baker's Bakery, a delicious breakfast and Our Place! And Begging Burro Mexican Restaurant, yummy. Don't forget the candy shop too.

PS - No tv at the cabin, we played Monopoly and Yahtzee. Laughed and some cried. Overall, a great experience to recharge the battery.

Each month here at the Moorhead American Legion, we receive numerous requests for donations from various organizations. Additionally, we have paid out \$53,892.00 in taxes. Therefore, we are now evaluating requests differently. Should we donate as much as in the past, or should we donate at all? We recognize that taxes are not decreasing, so adjustments must be made.

IRA - Individual Retirement Account QCD - Qualified Charitable Contribution

If you have an IRA and are 70½ or older, you can make a transfer from your IRA directly to a qualified charity using a QCD, and it will be tax-free. These transfers are a great way to give to a qualified charity, especially if you do not itemize deductions or file a tax return.

The amount is not reported as income and is not taken as an itemized deduction if you file a tax return. The amounts must be paid directly from your IRA to the qualified charity.

Our American Legion is a qualified charity. If you want to use this method to donate to our American Legion, contact the trustee of your IRA to arrange a direct payment to "American Legion Post 21".

Your holder (trustee) of your IRA or your tax preparer should be able to answer any other questions you have concerning a QCD.


