Dad and I attended the program at the Cemetery and then went to my mom's grave. It was a beautiful sight. Red, white, and blue flags on every grave and a beautiful blue sky. There is a tree that we always park by that helps us locate her grave. As we stood there by her grave, a news crew came over to interview my dad. He became so emotional that he couldn't speak and was sobbing. I believe that in that moment, not only was he thinking of my mom, but also all the friends and lives lost in his WW11 experience. When you are standing there surrounded by headstones and flags of thousands of heroes and their families, you can't help but feel the emotion of what they have all gone through for our country.

When I go on the Honor Flight to Arlington National Cemetery, I experience the same feeling. Now, when we visit my parents' graves at Fort Snelling, we find that tree, but there are rows and rows of added graves, and it takes us a while to find them. We walk amongst the graves, and as we look, we read the names to ourselves. And there they are, my parents, with all the heroes my mom was so proud to be with.

Of course, we all know by now that our Post 21 American Legion won the People's Choice Award (out of 81 businesses) at the Chamber Choice Award Banquet. It was an awesome experience to be there with the 22 other members of our Legion Family when our Post was announced the winner!!!! We all jumped up and started shouting, and the 600 people there were as excited and amazed as we were. Congratulations to our Post 21, your friendly American Legion!!!

Our next meeting is June 2nd, and it will be a salad potluck. Yum!!! We will also nominate and vote for our officers. We will start at 6:00 with an executive meeting at 5:30. FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY June 2025



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since we started conducting internments and burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 through 30 April 2025.

There are 277 urns in the Columbarium, 596 urns in the ground, 30 caskets in the private vaults, 277 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,182 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. This INCLUDES 942 VETERANS AND 240 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,182. THERE ARE 137 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 482, Navy –197, US Marine Corps – 64, US Air Force -195, Army/Air Force –4, Spouses – 240, for a total of 1,182 internments/burials.

During the month of March, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 17 internments/Burials for 303 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557 and 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 924. Since October 13, 2019, through April 30, 2025, we have accumulated 15,861 donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Happy summer,

Our offices are doing business as usual. Right now, we're asking for patience as everything is taking longer, from healthcare applications, claims, dependent enrollment, and appeals. 12,000 claims a day are being decided by the veteran benefit administration a day.

I was recently in DC, and many things we discussed regarding cuts to VA staff across the board. Cost-cutting ideas that were spoken of in DC that would affect our Veterans in ND:

1. End Individual Unemployability at vets' retirement age
2. Reduce benefits when the vet hits Social Security retirement age
3. Reduce VA benefits for vets with low ratings 0-20%
4. End VA medical care for vets in priority groups 7 and 8

I want to be open and direct: the topics recently discussed regarding veterans' issues were meant to inform and clarify, not to alarm anyone receiving benefits. It's important to have honest conversations about the systems that affect us, and I remain committed to doing so with transparency and respect. I will continue to advocate for all veterans, ensuring your voices are heard and your needs are prioritized.

Honoring Our Fallen Heroes: The Meaning of Memorial Day

Memorial Day, observed annually on the last Monday of May, is a solemn federal holiday dedicated to honoring the men and women who lost their lives while serving in the United States Armed Forces. It's a day of remembrance, reflection, and national gratitude. The holiday traces its roots back to 1868. They chose the day to honor fallen soldiers of the Civil War by decorating their graves with flowers. Over time, as the nation healed and grew, the tradition evolved—eventually merging Northern and Southern observances into what we now recognize as Memorial Day. Today, it honors all American service members who have died in military service. Across the country, Americans visit cemeteries and memorials to pay their respects. Volunteers place American flags on the graves of the fallen, particularly in national cemeteries.

Shooting Sports

This month let's revisit Archery. The NASP (National Archery School Program) teaches focus, self-control, discipline, patience, and life lessons essential for success in school and life. Similar to the MN State Clay Target League, NASP aims to improve students' academic performance. Parents, grandparents, and others have noticed these positive changes. Both programs are among the safest high school sports with no serious accidents. Additionally, both shooting sports are co-ed and accessible to handicapped individuals.

NASP has significantly expanded since 2002. By 2004, 1.3 million students in 9577 schools participated, with 1638 tournaments held and 104,650 Basic Archery Instructors trained. NASP offers a \$1000 grant to schools starting a program. By 2024, NASP awarded \$4 million in scholarships to participants.

The NASP (National Archery in the Schools Program) is generally implemented as part of Physical Education classes. Our Post supports archery through Lake Agassiz Bowman. Historically, we contributed to their Archery Education program. Presently, our support includes providing 3-D targets for co-ed youth and cub shooters.

Moorhead American Legion Gaming Tidbits

May 20, 2025

The Minnesota legislature, with the help of the Native American Gambling Board, has made a big change to the way the E-Tab machines operate in Minnesota. Due to this change, our gambling revenue has declined by \$90,000 in the first quarter. This loss to our charitable gaming revenue will impact how much we can donate to our Veterans, local youth programs, and to our community.

As if this change to E-Tabs was not enough, the White Earth Gaming Board wants to build a casino in our neighborhood, on non-reservation land and on our Aquifer. Some City and County Officials want to believe that this Casino WILL NOT reduce charitable gaming revenue, WILL NOT increase crime and bankruptcies in our neighborhood, WILL NOT raise our taxes (White Earth plans to put this land in "trust" /pay no taxes), WILL NOT put a strain on our infrastructure, schools, police, fire...etc. What do you think?

We are not against competition, but it is preferred to be on a level playing field. We have to pay TAXES, lots of taxes! If you are concerned, please contact your local, county, and state Officials.
