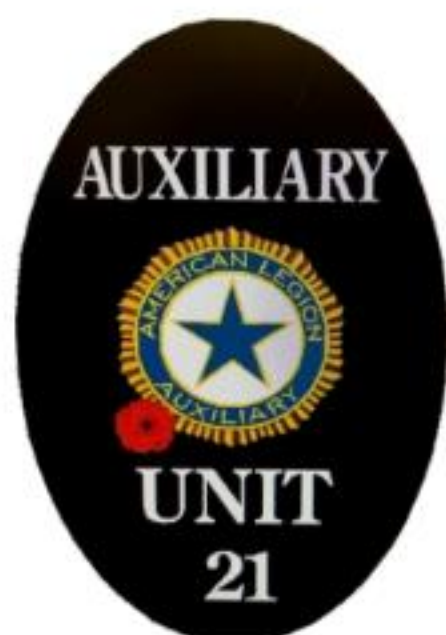

# Veterans Service Officer

Hello,

Memorial Day is a day of remembrance. It is a time to honor the men and women who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our nation. For many families, it is about remembering a grandpa, grandma, father, mother, uncle, cousin, or friend. For those who served, it is also about remembering the brothers and sisters we stood beside in uniform. Military service pushes people to the edge of exhaustion, but no one carries the burden alone. Service members lift each other up when someone no longer can. That bond creates something difficult to explain — you dig deep, not for yourself, but for the people beside you. Those teammates and fellow service members become heroes and family. This Memorial Day, I hope we all took time to reflect, remember, and honor those we have lost.

One veteran we recently lost was Diane Carlson Evans, a Minnesota native, Army nurse, and founder of the Vietnam Women's Memorial in Washington, D.C. She passed away Wednesday at the age of 79. Carlson Evans grew up on a dairy farm in Buffalo, Minnesota. After graduating from nursing school in Minneapolis, she joined the Army Nurse Corps and served one year in Vietnam. During her service, she worked in the burn unit of the 36th Evacuation Hospital in Vung Tau and at the 71st Evacuation Hospital in Pleiku, caring for wounded soldiers during the war. After returning home, she dedicated years of her life to making sure the sacrifices of women veterans were recognized and remembered. In 1984, she co-founded the Vietnam Women's Memorial Foundation and led the effort to establish a memorial honoring the more than 265,000 American women who served during the Vietnam War. Her legacy reminds us that service comes in many forms, and that courage, sacrifice, and compassion should never be forgotten.

When they all arrive at Hope-Page Elementary School on Memorial Day, those marking the solemn day will hear the incredible story of a man who, for years, was buried in a Page, North Dakota, cemetery grave marked simply, "Unknown." It turns out, W.H. Tate was no unknown. He was Sgt. William Howard Tate of Kentucky, who fought in World War II. And now, years after his death, this veteran is getting the honor and praise he earned. It was back in 1970 that people in Page woke up to news that the body of a man had been discovered near the railroad tracks. Nobody knew who he was. For decades, he remained in an unmarked grave at the Page cemetery. That all changed when, a few years back, his remains were exhumed. And this week, crews from Dakota Monument arrived before Memorial Day weekend to properly honor and give the veteran an impressive monument.

"Every Memorial Day, I remember my father stopping by the grave of the unknown and looking at the stone and asking, 'I wonder if he was a veteran,'" said Todd Nelson, a Page native and researcher. Nelson and his wife, Joni, have gone down the rabbit hole on Tate.

"It is a mystery, just like his death was," Todd said. Tate received the Silver Star in World War II for his role fighting in Europe and on D-Day. He survived the war and quite possibly took the train to Page, the home of his comrade Edward Hanley, who died in the war. "He obviously brought the war with him, likely suffered PTSD and tried to search for his peace and heard of Page, North Dakota, through stories from Hanley," Todd said.

The Cass County coroner and an anthropology team from Southeast Missouri State University helped answer the question of the unknown man at the Page cemetery. There are no immediate family left or photos, but now, a monument and a planned Memorial Day speech by Todd will honor and pay tribute to him and so many others who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

"The man gets recognition after 55 years after being ignored, a nobody. But he wasn't a nobody. His life was amazing," Todd said. Researchers also believe Tate may have been part of Gen. George S. Patton's "Ghost Army" in World War II. The top-secret soldiers who were experts in tactical deception. The story of Tate will be heard at 10 a.m. at the Page elementary school on Memorial Day, Monday, May 25.

FARGO, N.D. (KVRR) — In 2015, combat veteran Brady Oberg died by suicide after struggling for years with post-traumatic stress disorder. Ever since, fellow veterans have organized rucks across North Dakota and Minnesota to highlight the importance of mental health for members of the military. John Dalziel has been spearheading these rucks for almost a decade now, after serendipitously getting in contact with the parents of Brady Oberg. He'll be the first to tell you, even after the thousands of miles he's walked, the emotion never goes away, and the mission never becomes less important. The 9th Annual Brady's B2B Ruck took place from May 21st to the 23rd, with the Fargo-Moorhead installment concluding with a short memorial service at the National Cemetery. "This is not just a cemetery. It is a hallowed ground. Every headstone here represents a life committed to something greater than themselves," said Dalziel during the service. He says the goal is simple — honor those who have been lost, ensure veterans know they are not alone, and keep the conversation surrounding veteran mental health and suicide prevention in the public eye. It's estimated 17 veterans die by suicide every day in the United States. If you or someone you know is struggling, remember that there are resources.

The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline is available 24/7.
