March is Community Service Month for the American Legion Auxiliary. Community Service demonstrates who we are, what we do, and why we matter. The Community Service program focuses on making community life better.

Volunteers are crucial for groups such as ours to survive, and many other organizations benefit and depend on our volunteer work. 1 in 4 Americans do volunteer work. The average time each person spends volunteering is about 52 hours a year. Minnesota is the second most engaged state active in volunteer work with 45.1% volunteers!

Let's look at some American Legion Auxiliary statistics nationwide from 2022-2023 taken off the website.

- *\$28,798,483 dollars raised/spent for Veterans, military families, youth, scholarships, and communities
- *551,825 Number of Veterans/active duty/reserve military served
- *183,865 Number of military families served
- *405,965 Number of youth served
- *6,237,391 hours of volunteer work
- *14,066,097 raised/spent on Veterans, military, and their families. Within that, \$2,042,345 was raised from poppies.

Our Unit 21 Auxiliary members are part of those statistics. What % of our American Legion family relies on volunteers? 100%. Let's continue to be proud that we are adding to the statistics by doing our part as we help others in our community, help Veterans, youth and our Legion Family.

FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ItS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internment/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 31 DECEMBER 2023.

The figures for January 2024 were not available at this time. They will be added to next month's newsletter. I apologize for the inconvenience.

What is the best thing to do if you find a gorilla in your bed?

There are 210 urns in the Columbarium, 467 urns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 202 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 906 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 717 VETERANS AND 189 SPOUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 906. AND THERE ARE 94 COUPLES ENTERED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

The breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 381, Navy – 148, US Marine Corps – 50, US Air Force -134, ARMY/AF – 4, and Spouses – 189 for a total of 906 internments/burial.

Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 20222 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557. From 13 October 2019 through 31 DECEMBER 2023, we have accumulated 11,766 donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILL NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.





Breaking: 3-year American Legion Membership Now Available, even if You already Renewed for 2024!

Breaking:



3-year American Legion Membership is now available, even if you have already renewed for 2024! This is exciting and GREAT news and can be a big money saver...

Dues will be increasing (if you haven't heard, \$5 for National, \$3 for Department, and \$1 for the 9th District for the 2025 year, and if you get on to this NOW, you could see savings of \$9.00 a year (or a total of \$27.00 for the 3 years).

If you renewed for the 2024 American Legion membership year prior to the new multiyear membership rollout on Dec. 4, you can now take advantage of a three-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year.

Visit legion.org/renew for the multiyear membership for 2025, 2026, and 2027.

Legionnaires still needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining the organization for the first time can also lock in a three-year membership (2024, 2025, and 2026) by visiting legion.org/renew or legion.org/join.

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the National American Legion website (legion.org/renew and legion.org/join). Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.
- Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.
- There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.
- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.

As the political punches are now in full swing, I was able to attend a leadership summit in Washington, D.C., at the beginning of this month. This summit brought key leadership to us members regarding national and state goals, all while talking to leaders in health, appeals, claims, and the overall agenda of helping veterans.

I had the opportunity to talk to ND key leaders in DC to assist veterans with transportation, healthcare, gaps in service, and the passage of two bills that would keep out "sharks" or nonaccredited representatives out of our states who poach on veterans. The services that Curt and I offer are always and will be free. These "sharks" promise the world, however, at a high cost, taking away veteran's compensation. It's called the Guard Act, HR 1139; please contact your leadership to get this done. Our veterans need this protection. The other is the CVSO act, S. 106, which federal funding could be applied for, resulting in monies going straight to the counties in need, bypassing the state, which could help with hiring, keeping their office doors open more, and ensuring veterans get the benefits they deserve.

Please be on the lookout for new opportunities for veterans to apply for healthcare on March 5th, as anyone who was exposed to toxic substances after 9/11 can now apply.

The Fargo VA is still in its infancy of a better establishment transportation system and is located in Fargo. Please contact me for more information if you're an eligible candidate to receive a ride to and from your appointments.

Our office has just got more Vietnam coins for eligible veterans who served boots on the ground or during that era. Please contact me for more information or if you have any questions.


