May greetings!



### **LOCK IN A 3-YEAR MEMBERSHIP**

More than 8,000 American Legion members have taken advantage of the new multiyear membership option for renewals and new joins. Ready to lock-in a three year membership before the national per-capita dues increase goes into effect? It's easy. Here's how:

- For renewals, visit <u>legion.org/renew</u> and select the three-year membership option.
- For new joins, visit <u>legion.org/join</u> and select the three-year membership option.

"We have wanted this multiyear option for our members, and now that it's here, the excitement for it shows in the number of Legionnaires who have taken advantage of it," National Membership & Post Activities Committee Chairman Matt Jabaut said. "The multiyear membership option saves members from receiving renewal notices every year, and it's another great benefit to being an American Legion member."

The American Legion's national per-capita dues will increase from \$18.50 to \$23.50 starting with the 2025 membership year. The \$5 increase will go into effect July 1, 2024.

### Reminders about multiyear membership:

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website (<u>legion.org/renew</u> and <u>legion.org/join</u>). Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.
- Payment for the three-year membership is upfront.
- There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.
- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.



### **Veterans Service Officer**

Happy Easter,

I hope everyone had a safe and happy Easter. There's a couple of items that I would like to bring to your attention. One is for Minnesota veterans called the Post 9/11 Veteran Service Bonus. The other is opening VA healthcare to over one million veterans nationwide that were exposed to toxins and air pollutants. Please call myself or Curt for any eligibility questions. We also want to thank all Vietnam veterans for their service, as March 29th is National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

The Post-9/11 Veteran Service Bonus

The Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) has a long history of awarding service bonuses to Minnesota Veterans who served in America's wars. Starting in 1919 after World War I, through World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Persian Gulf War, and now the Global War on Terrorism. MDVA recognizes the sacrifices and courage Minnesotans took to defend our country.

The 2022 Legislature passed, and Governor Walz signed the first-ever Veterans Omnibus Bill that included funding for a service bonus payable to eligible Veterans who served from 9/11/01 to 8/30/21. MDVA is honored to facilitate this program for eligible Veterans currently serving service members or Veterans' beneficiaries.

The 2023 Legislative Session resulted in several changes that expanded Minnesota Veteran eligibility for the Post-9/11 Service Bonus. Newly eligible Veterans now include:

Veterans who did not enlist/begin their service in Minnesota. Recipients of the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal may now receive the full bonus allotment. Veterans who were previously denied the bonus or are now eligible for a larger bonus can reapply based on the changes that were made this session.

MDVA began processing payments the week of July 25th, 2022. Applicants can expect their mailed check approximately 12 weeks after approval.

The application opened July 7th, 2022, and will run until June 30th, 2024, or until funds have been exhausted.

March 29th was National Vietnam War Veterans Day because on March 29th, 1973, Military Assistance Command, Vietnam (MACV) was disbanded, and the last U.S. combat troops departed the Republic of Vietnam. President Barack Obama signed a presidential proclamation in 2012, designating March 29th as the annual observance of Vietnam War Veterans Day. The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act, signed into law in 2017, also designates March 29th of each year as National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

VA Health Care Enrollment

In one of the largest-ever expansions of Veteran health care, all Veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards during military service – at home or abroad – will be eligible for VA health care beginning March 5th, 2024.

At the direction of President Biden, the VA is expanding health care eligibility to millions of Veterans – including all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11 – years earlier than called for by the PACT Act. Veterans who were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving in the military – at home or abroad – will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care beginning March 5th, 2024. This means that all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11 will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for VA benefits. Additionally, Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty in the United States will also be eligible to enroll. Additionally, VA health care is often more affordable than non-VA health care for Veterans.

VA encourages all eligible Veterans to visit VA.gov/PACT or call 1-800-MYVA411 to learn more and apply for VA health care beginning March 5th. Since President Biden signed the PACTAct into law on August 10th, 2022, more than 500,000 Veterans have enrolled in VA health care.

"If you're a Veteran who may have been exposed to toxins or hazards while serving our country, at home or abroad, we want you to come to us for the health care you deserve," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "VA is proven to be the best, most affordable health care in America for Veterans — and once you're in, you have access for life. So don't wait; enroll starting March 5th."

"Beginning March 5th, we're making millions of Veterans eligible for VA health care years earlier than called for by the PACT Act," said VA Under Secretary for Health Shercef Elnahal, M.D. "With this expansion, the VA can care for all Veterans who served in the Victnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11. We can also care for Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty here at home—by working with chemicals, pesticides, lead, asbestos, certain paints, nuclear weapons, x-rays, and more. We want to bring all of these Veterans to VA for the care they've earned and deserve."

This expansion of care covers Vietnam Veterans, Gulf War Veterans, Iraq War Veterans, Afghanistan War Veterans, and Veterans who deployed in support of contingency operations for the Global War on Terror (Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Freedom's Sentinel, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Operation Inherent Resolve, and Resolve Support Mission), and more.

For more information about how the PACT Act is helping Veterans and their survivors, visit the VA's PACT Act Dashboard. To apply for care or benefits today, visit VA.gov/PACT or call 1-800-MYVA411. More information on eligibility can be found at VA.gov/PACT.

Also, March 19th marked the 21st anniversary of the start of Operation Iraqi Freedom — when so many brave men and women stood at the precipice of peace and war, ready to sacrifice their lives for our country's safety and freedom.




