FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, through 31 OCTOBER 2025.

THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, thru 31 March 2026.

There are 344 urns in the Columbarium, 706 urns in the ground, 31 caskets in the private vaults, 326 caskets in the Government vaults and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,409.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, INCLUDE 1,105 VETERANS AND 304 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,409. THERE ARE 164 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE break down per branch of service is: Army – 558, Navy – 235, US Marine Corps – 74, US Air Force – 2234, ARMY/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 304, for a total of 1,409, Internments/burial.

During the month of March, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 28 Interment/ Burials for 423 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021=3,373, 2022=2,798, 2023=2,557, 2024 = 2,889 and 2025=2,799, 2026= 707.

Since 13 October 2019 thru 31 MARCH 2026, we have accumulated 18,339, donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAS BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Hi,

Veterans & Community Update

I was in Washington DC about a month ago and I'm reporting back to all veterans and members what the VA is looking forward to and assisting in to make our lives hopefully better. The main theme is timeliness and trying to speed up processes for us. Please let me know if you have any question and I'd be happy to meet you your group or individually. We have started the "Stand Down III" preparations and if you have any thoughts or comments and would like to help please let me know too. We will be offering many VA services, gear, and a free meal to include a 9/11 hero speaking on those events which happened 25 years ago this September 11th – it will also be the nations 250th birthday. Thank you to all those veterans and the communities that support them.

The VA is working on a new system to get veterans' records faster—sometimes called "Day Zero" access.

What this means:

- Less waiting for records
- Faster claim decisions
- Less stress for veterans and families

Right now, claims take about 74–81 days on average. This change could cut that time significantly.

New VA Health Record System

The VA is rolling out a new Electronic Health Record (EHR) system to improve care.

- Michigan starts: April 11
- North Dakota expected: 2027
- Nationwide goal: 2031

Why it matters:

- Doctors can see your records faster
- Better coordination between VA and community providers
- Improved care overall
- Improving Veteran Healthcare

The Veterans Health Administration is working to:

- Reduce red tape
- Make care easier to access
- Strengthen community care options

The goal is simple: make healthcare work better for veterans

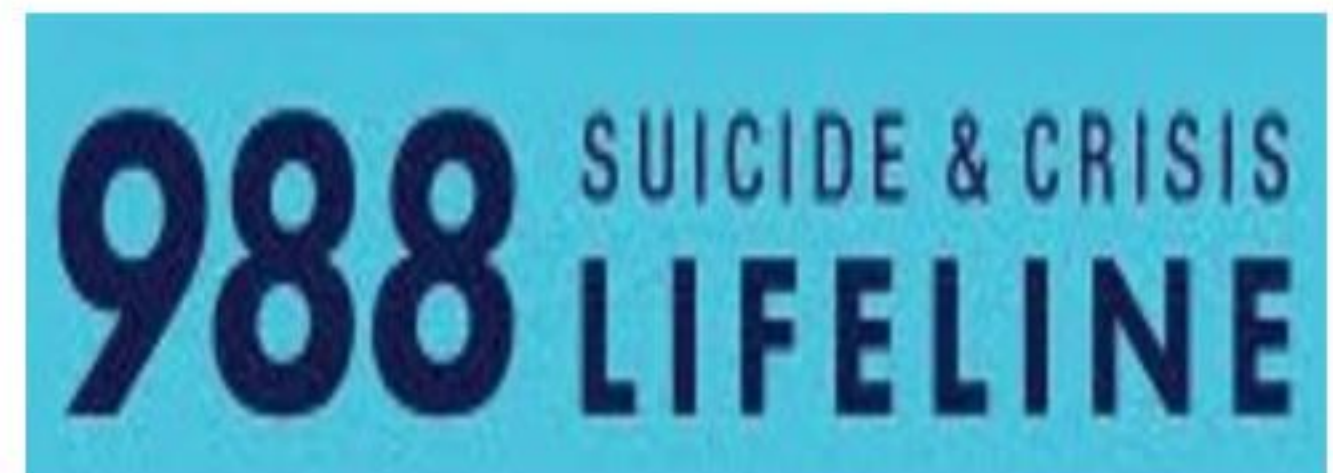

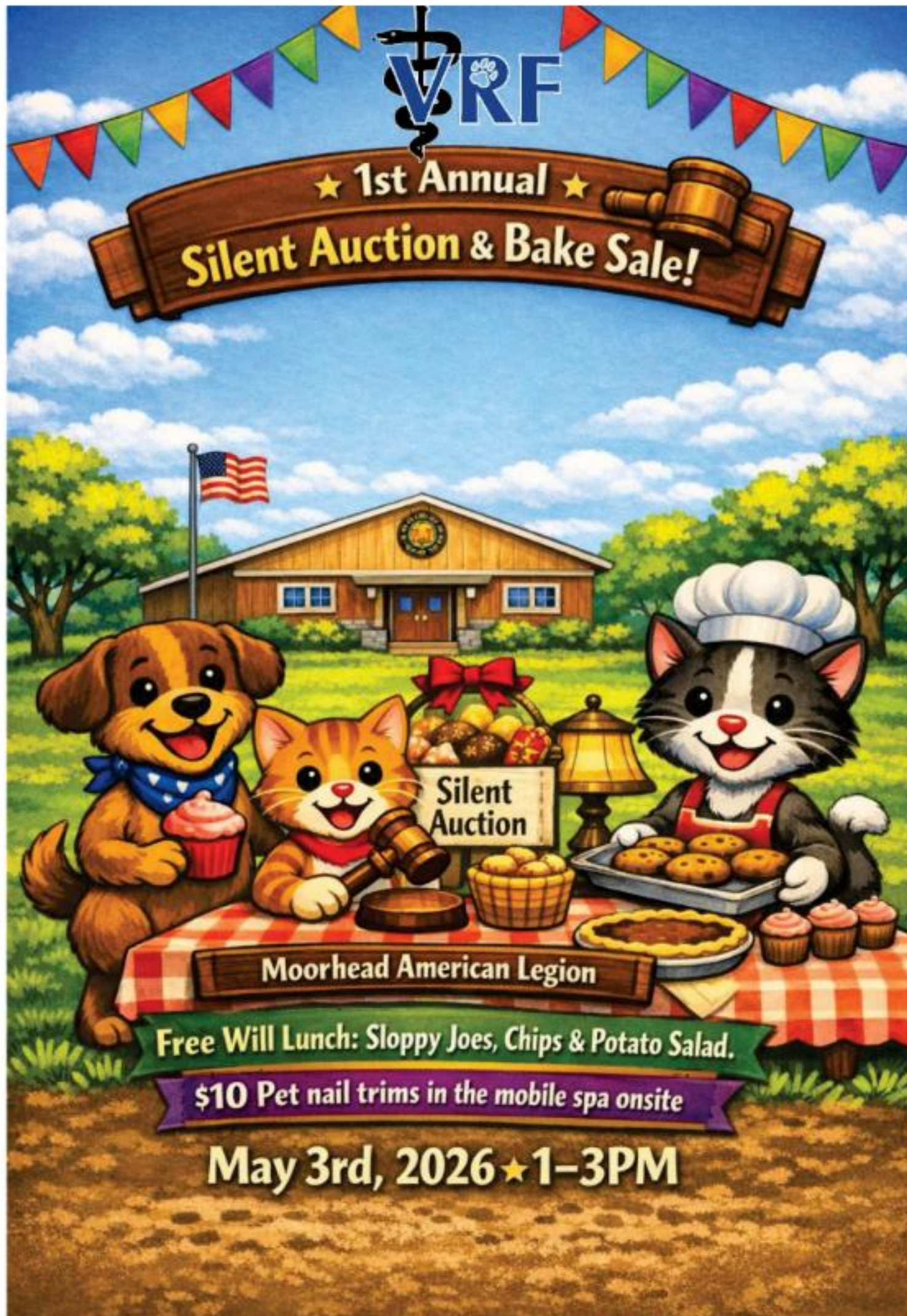
