Thanks to our members who have already renewed for 2026 and those who have joined in the past few months, we have already met and exceeded the Department goal of 60% by November 11, but we can't stop now. We still need 55 new or renewed memberships to meet our 100% goal. Remember, every Legion member has several people who are eligible for Auxiliary membership - spouse, daughter, granddaughter, mother, sister. They don't have to live in Moorhead. We have members all over the country. Female veterans are eligible for Auxiliary membership through their own service. For all others, the veteran through whom a new member is eligible must be a member of a Legion Post. If you know of a prospective member whose veteran relative is not yet a Legion member, I'm sure our local Post 21 would be happy to sign them up too.

Keep in mind, the Auxiliary membership year runs from Department Convention to Department Convention (July to July), not the calendar year, so even though it's still 2025, we are working on 2026 membership. If a member has not paid their 2026 dues by January 31, 2026, they are considered delinquent and their membership privileges and benefits are suspended.

There are only a few days left to get your new or renewal membership card stamped with an Early Bird. If you pay your 2026 dues on or before Veteran's Day (November 11), your membership card will be marked with an Early Bird stamp which is good for one free drink at the Moorhead Legion.








October was here and gone. Our riding season is running out of time. Wow.!! But a wonderful month nonetheless.

FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, through 30 SEPTEMBER 2025.

There are 321 urns in the Columbarium, 675 urns in the ground, 30 caskets in the private vaults, 297 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,325.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY INCLUDE 1,045 VETERANS AND 280 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,325. THERE ARE 158 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 529, Navy – 221, US Marine Corps – 69, US Air Force – 222, ARMY/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 280, for a total of 1,325 Internments/burials.

During the month of September, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 25 internments/Burials for 345 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557 and 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 2,593. Since 13 October 2019 thru 30 September 2025. We have accumulated 17,755 donated volunteer hours.



The Minnesota High School Clay Target

The fall league is underway, with youth shooters completing six of eight weeks. Participation is lower than in spring, which is typical since MHD doesn't have a team this season. The young shooters are performing well and enjoying themselves. Park Christian has 24 coed shooters, while DGF has a slightly higher number.

Post-21's support for Glyndon Rod and Gun has been put to good use; the shooting range is well maintained, and all clay target machines are fully functional. Thanks to your backing, local youth have access to the range—which is essential for their clay target league, run entirely by volunteers who coach, score keep, and maintain the facilities. Volunteers mow and care for the grounds each week, keep equipment in top condition, and are present at every shoot to ensure smooth operation.

Volunteers open the range gate, clubhouse, and bathrooms for classes. If a gun fails, it must be taken off the range to the garage for repairs. The GF club volunteers are also shooters; one has repair experience and tools. Without these volunteers and the shooting range, there would be no youth clay target league.
