Fall brings many changes. We are enjoying the cooler weather, the beautiful colors when the leaves change, cheering for our favorite team, and the kids go back to school.

October is Education Month in our department calendar. The purpose of the Education Committee is to promote quality education for children and adults through classroom activities, literacy programs, scholarship promotion, and support of education beyond high school, with a special emphasis on children of Veterans and service members.

Our Unit 21 Auxiliary sponsors a High School scholarship each year of \$500. The students must apply and write an essay on a designated topic. The applications are then reviewed by our committee and a student is then selected. The scholarship is presented at their school's award night in the spring. The actual money is then sent to the college when they enroll. We have also supported local High School programs and activities with donations to help students with expenses so they can participate if they need financial help.

The American Legion National Organization awards four scholarships annually.

- 1. Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship of \$5000. Fifteen are awarded.
- 2. Spirit of Youth Scholarship for Junior Members, five scholarships of \$5000 each.
- 3. Non-traditional Student Scholarship for those in the Legion Family who go to college later in life. Five awarded at \$2000 each.
- 4. Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship, ten scholarships of \$2500 each. Scholarship applications are available online at www.ALAforVeterans.org

We enjoyed sponsoring 5 Veterans from the VA Hospital for lunch at the Legion on September 8th. The veterans were able to order off the menu and really enjoyed the good food and conversation. FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 through 31 August 2025.

There are 316 urns in the Columbarium, 660 urns in the ground, 30 caskets in the private vaults, 292 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,300.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY INCLUDE 1,027 VETERANS AND 273 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,300. THERE ARE 156 COUPLES INTERED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERYe breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 519, Navy – 217, US Marine Corps – 69, US Air Force – 218, Army/Air Force – 4, Spouses – 273, for a total of 1,300 Internments/burials.

During July, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 20 internments/Burials for 314 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557 and 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 2,248. Since 13 October 2019 through 31 August 2025. We have accumulated 17,410 donated volunteer hours.

WHAT IS AN "UNCLAIMED VETERAN"? 1. AN Unclaimed Veteran has no living family member to claim him at the time of his passing. 2. There may have been one or two living family members, but there was a family dispute years ago, and they have not talked to one another ever since. 3. The family member had health problems and could not travel. Also, they had financial problems and could not afford to pay the funeral expenses. Once you claim responsibility for the deceased veteran, you are responsible for all expenses outside of the national cemetery. We had an Unclaimed Veteran on July 7 and August 8, 2025.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHS AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has conducted Military Honors in all kinds of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an internment of a Veteran due to bad weather. The family is responsible for making that decision.

Happy October,

As we start getting into our colder months, let's check on our battle buddies, and as always, please use #988. 988 has seen a 150% increase since its inception in July of 2022. The state of ND (via FirstLink) reported a 68% increase in "contacts" (calls/texts/chats) to the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline in 2024 compared to 2023. If you know anyone, please have them use this great service, as you're not alone.

Flu Shots are now being offered through the Fargo VA – check your local VA or CBOC's– walk ins, drive throughs and blitzes are going on until the end of October.

Habitat for Humanity is looking for a veteran for a home in 2027 – need candidates and would be in the FM area. Please reach out to Pete Christopher at 218-512-0109 for more information or the Cass County Veteran Service Office for application assistance.

VA claims were up 6600 from last year – 2024 – as of mid-August, the VA had processed 2.5 million claims with an approval rate of 61.8% and was getting 1.3 million veterans' and families' benefits. Please talk to Curt or me as we can seek increases and new claims for veterans. Appeals can be reopened with new and relevant evidence. As always, we're here to help and make sure your claims will be tracked, and please do not file on your own. We're free and will never charge for any services.

CAPTEL is offering veterans free phones with hearing loss – POC Tamara Eade – tamara.eade@oeius.org – must have internet connection – large display for captions – amplified sound for those with hearing loss. She will come into your home and set up the phone for no charge. The process takes about an hour.

Homeward Animal Shelter is looking for veterans to adopt dogs, as you will receive a 25% discount on their application process. Please contact – Tasha Haug at 701-239-0077. Please look below at the dogs currently available for adoption. Up to 80% of our animals may be in foster care at any given time, so to meet dogs in foster care, please fill out an adoption application, and we will be in touch! If you would like to see dogs in the shelter, please stop in during open house hours, which are Tuesday-Friday from 4-7pm and Saturdays from 2-6pm.

We just wanted to say "thank you" to all those who attended the second annual Stand Down in downtown Fargo last week. We had over 400 people in attendance with over 40 service tables helping you, the veteran, and your families with your specific needs. Thank you for attending and making this a huge success.



Shooting Sports

As I expected, the shooting sports picked up again in September. On September 13th, the Clay Target teams started their fall league. The first team to shoot was the Concordia College team. This team is listed as part of a college-level clay target league. Usually, it has about 15 shooters. The next team to begin the fall league is the Minnesota State High School Clay Target League. The teams participating in the Fall league are Dilworth/Glyndon/Felton (DGF) and Park Christian School. These two schools have been competing for several years. The other school that usually participates is Moorhead High School. They will not field a team this fall, but I believe they will be back in the spring league.

I spoke with Jon Rude, the head coach of the Park Christian team. This fall, he has 24 youth shooters. Like in previous years, the Park Christian team is coed. I believe it's beneficial for these young people to compete in high school sports, as it teaches them to compete both as individuals and as team members. Some of these youth might never shoot again, hunt, or be involved with guns. They have learned about guns, and the most important lesson is that they now understand gun safety and the responsibility that comes with owning and handling a firearm.
