FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE It'S DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

For the month of FEBRUARY, we had 6 internments/burials, 1 urn – 2 IN LOT # 2 (GROUND) AND 3 IN THE – CCA(COLUMNBARRIUM), AND 2 CASKES IN LOT # 5.

There are 163 urns in the Columbarium, 367 urns in the ground, 26 caskets in the private vaults, 171 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall. WE HAVE 584 VETERANS AND 145 POUSES INTERED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, FOR A TOTAL OF 729 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS. THIS INCLUDES THE 77 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE break down per branch of service is: Army – 3320, Navy – 113, Marine Corps – 441, Air Force - 106, USAAF - 4, and Spouses – 145, for a total of 729 internments/burials

The oldest veteran - EARL HAROLD ROESLER - 16 FEBRUARY 1919 - 21 JUNE 2021 = 102 AND 4 MONTHS.

The oldest spouse – EVANGELINE DITTUS – 6 JULY 1921 – 22 NOVEMBER 2022 = 101 AND 4 MONTHS. No branch of service listed – ROY LOUIS WAKEFIELD – 31 JULY 1946 – 1 OCTOBER 2020 = 74 AND 2 MONTHS NOTE: WE LOCATED HIS BRANCH OF SERVICE – ARMY – FOLLOWING IS HIS SERVICE – Three tours in Vietnam (Red Catchers, HQ 199th LIB USARPAC, HHC 1st AVN BDE (WDG 3AA) 'Golden Hawks'), active with US Army Reserve, and the National Guard (in ND, MN, TX) throughout his life until official retirement in 2006.

WE HAVE DONATED 100 VOLUNTEER HOURS FOR FEBRUARY 2023. OUR YEARLY VOLUNTEER HOURS ARE – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 220. From 13 October 2019 thru 28 FEBRUARY 2023, WE HAVE ACCULULATED 10,026 DONATED VOLUNTEER HOURS.

THERE HAS BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA, LOCAL CHURCHES, AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILL NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

WE ARE NOW USING THE SHELTER TO PERFORM THE INTERNMENT/BURIAL SERVICES. THE WALLS ON THE NORTH AND WEST SIDE OF THE SHELTER ARE UP BUT NOT TOPPED OFF PROPERLY, BUT THEY ARE USABLE. A NICE WIND BLOCK. IT WILL BE COMPLETED IN THE SPRING.

Happy Easter!

April means "hopefully" spring and tax time – If you're a veteran or know anyone struggling to find someone to help them file their taxes, a program does exist in both Fargo and Moorhead. Please reach out to your local Community Action Partnership or CAP Lakes and Prairie for Free Tax Preparation Services.

Each year, millions of people have their taxes prepared for free by IRS-certified volunteers. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance and Tax Counseling for the Elderly programs (VITA) have helped people for more than 40 years. Over 1.3 million free tax returns were prepared for Veterans since the inception of the MOU at nearly 8,000 free tax preparation sites across the country. For the Fargo office, please contact 701-232-2452 and the Moorhead Office, please contact 218-512-1500 and ask about the VITA program and free tax preparation for veterans or low-income singles and families.

VA Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry

On March 20, 2023, marked the 20-year anniversary of the start of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF). VA estimates that more than 3.6M Veterans served in the Post-9/11 era. This is where it is necessary to see your local veteran service officer or representative due to toxic exposure through the PACT ACT. This act expanded and extended VA healthcare for those veterans and added 20 new presumptive conditions from burn pits.

VA established the Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry (AHOBPR) in 2014 to help put data to work for Veterans through research about potential health effects of airborne hazard exposures. By joining the registry, you can provide information to help us better understand whether long-term health conditions may be related to these exposures. Even if you have not experienced any symptoms or illnesses you believe are related to exposures during military service, your participation in the registry could help VA provide better care to all Veterans. You are eligible to participate in the registry if you were deployed to the Southwest Asia theater of operations or Egypt any time after August 2, 1990, or Afghanistan, Djibouti, Syria, or Uzbekistan on or after September 11, 2001.

Regions and countries include: Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Djibouti, Gulf of Aden, Gulf of Oman, Oman, Qatar, United Arab Emirates, waters of the Persian Gulf, Arabian Sea, Red Sea, Syria, Uzbekistan, and Egypt.

Operations and campaigns include: Desert Shield and Desert Storm (ODS/S), Iraqi Freedom (OIF), Enduring Freedom (OEF), and New Dawn (OND).



RED RIVER VALLEY WOOD CARVERS (our mission)

"To promote camaraderie among wood carvers and encourage the continuance of the art through Education, Public display, and Civic involvement."

The RRVWC's consists of men and women of varying degrees of carving experience and knowledge. Ranging from less then a year to some with over 30 years of carving. Members have knowledge and interests in many different areas of wood carving, from whittling, chip carving, relief carving, tree bark carving, etc. Some of our members like to do mainly one style of carving, while others like to do various types of carving to experience as much as they can. Either way works for its, whatever you enjoy doing. The thing that drew me to the club was the open, friendly, encouraging attitude of the members toward each other and those who are new to the club.

The RRVWC happily has a working agreement with the Moorhead American Legion Post 21 located at 301 30th St S Moorhead, MN. We are able to use their facility (which luckily also has a working kitchen to purchase lunch if desired) for our bi-weekly carving sessions, monthly meetings, and various training classes. Every Tuesday and Thursday from 11 am-3 pm, we have "open carving sessions" where members can gather together to carve on whatever project they are currently working on while experiencing camaraderie and fellowship with one another. Our monthly meetings are usually on the 1st Saturday of the month, which usually includes some type of carving training class also scheduled for that same day. The training classes are open to both members and the Public, so come check us out! The classes run from 9 am-4 pm, with a break at 10:30 am for the club meeting. Some examples of recent training classes are; a "Gnome Wood Carving Class," a "Wood Spirits Carving Class," a "Crappy {fish}) on a Stick Carving Class," a "Colored Pencil Drawing Class," and a "Floral Relief Carving Class." Arrangements for more training classes for the near future are in the works!

An area where the RVWC's get involved with the Public is at "Touchmark at Harwood Groves" retirement community located at 1200 Harwood Dr. S Fargo, ND. We have an arrangement with the facility staff that members meet there on the 2nd Monday of each month. They have tables/chairs set up in the main lobby area where we display our previous carvings while we carve on our current projects. But more importantly, we visit with the facility residents who are routinely stopping by to see what we are doing. Many are genuinely interested in what we are doing and routinely thank us for being there each month.

On April 14th - 16th of this year will be our annual "Red River Valley Wood Arts Festival" held at the Fargo Air Museum located at 1609 19th Ave N Fargo. This festival is open to the Public and allows a chance for the various area wood carvers and other artists to display their creations. There will also be some training classes that both club members and the Public can sign up for!

RRVWC's has a Public Facebook Page called "Carvers and Friends of the RRVWC," on which people post updates, information, and photos about the club and its activities. We encourage everyone to check it out to get a better feel of what the club and its members stand for. And whether this club is something that you might be interested in becoming a member of. We are always looking for new members and we hope that you are one of them!
