

# FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE It'S DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

For the month of May, we had 25 internments/burials, 13 Urns in LOT # 2 (GROUND) AND 8 Urns IN THE – CCA (COLUMBARIUM) AND 4 CASKETS IN LOT # 5.

How do you prevent a summer cold?

There are 183 urns in the Columbarium, 408 urns in the ground, 26 caskets in the private vaults, 183 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 802 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 637 VETERANS AND 165 SPOUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 802. AND THERE ARE 85 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army – 342, Navy – 129, Marine Corps – 46, US Air Force -116, USAF - 4, and Spouses – 165, for a total of 802 internments/burial.

10. UNCLAIMED VETERAN-6 JUNE 2023

AHLES, JEROME JOSEPH - 6 JUNE 1947 – 22 APRIL 2023. INTERNMENT 6 JUNE 2023 AT FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. Mr. Ahles was a member of the MN Veterans Home in Fergus Falls, Mn, at the time of his death.

Mr. Ahles graduated from Wahpeton High School in 1965. After high school, Jerome and a close friend, Arnold Fischer, joined the US Navy for four years, serving in Vietnam on the USS Hancock and USS Currituck av7. After his service in the US Navy, Jerome attended NDSCS and UND, earning his Bachelor of Education Degree in 1973. Jerome was a member of the VFW. Mr. Fischer attended Jerome's internment. An estimated ninety people attended his internment. His parents, a twin sister, Mary Amundson, and a sister Paula Ahles were preceding him in death.

### **Veterans Service Officer**

#### A Sad day

Our community served a great loss on July 14th, as Officer Jake Wallin was killed in Fargo, while two other officers were critically wounded and a female bystander. Officer Wallin was all about service as he joined the Fargo Police force about three months ago. His father pinned him in a ceremony that was streamed live on the FPD social media page. He served in the Minnesota National Guard and was deployed to Afghanistan and Iraq, according to his obituary. He is a hero and one who gave his life to protect others. You learn these traits early in life from your parents, siblings, grandparents, teachers, and coaches. Then he dedicated his short life to continuing his service in our community. It's hard for me to fathom right now how a person can come home from two deployments only to be killed in our community, still protecting us. Fargo is a safe community, and the Fargo Police Chief has assured us that there are no longer threats due to this incident. We must stay vigilant and strong during this horrific time. Reach out to a friend or counselor to talk and grieve as there's no right or wrong way to do so. This brings me back to the same feelings I had when Officer Jason Mozer was killed in 2016. I had the great honor to serve with him and saw how he operated both at home and abroad. Both young men and many similar qualities and the one thing that bonded them was going to work each day with a smile on their faces doing what they loved, service to others and their community. As we mourn the loss of Officer Wallin let's not forget about those who died protecting our freedoms both here at home and abroad. These men were brave and to the officer who took out the shooter, we say "thank you". His training and heroism are unmatched because he stayed calm and eliminated the threat to his back up, firefighters and first responders. We thank all men and women in any uniform as they fight each day to keep us all safe. Rest in peace Officers.





## **Dept of MN Law Enforcement Officer of the Year**



Scott Kostohryz of the Moorhead Police Department was name the 2023 Minnesota American Legion named him Minnesota Law Officer of the Year earlier this month, they were also looking well beyond the hours he spends on duty.

Scott Kostohryz received his law enforcement training at Alexandria Technical College, then received further education from Minnesota State University, Mankato, St. Cloud State University, and Minnesota State University, Moorhead, completing his bachelor's degree.

He started in 2004 with the Moorhead Police Department. He had been a Police Explorer in Mankato, and he was able to restart a Police Explorer post in Moorhead.

Over the years, he has served as a field training officer, SWAT team member, and a detective. He presently leads the use-of-force instruction in areas of defensive tactics, Taser, and mobile field force. He supervises the School Resource Officer Program and a patrol team.

As a patrol sergeant, he is responsible for a beat within the city, and he leads community-oriented policing efforts, including as liaison to the homeless.

He also leads the Police Athletics & Activities League, or PAL, which

impacts 2,500 kids in the city through programs such as Shop with a Cop or kids playing hockey with officers, or a summer bicycle giveaway.

Kostohryz has been married to his wife, Heather, for 22 years, and they have three Scott Kostohryz children: Carter, 19, Evan, 17, and Abby, 14. They are active in sports and church. Carter is presently attending the U.S. Naval Academy.

On Jan. 8, 2009, a mail carrier reported a house fire. At the same time, Moorhead firefighters were occupied with a large structure fire. Icy roads and the other fire delayed the response. "The front door was locked, but he found the back door open and announced his presence. There was no answer, but he observed the smoke-filled room and could make out a person's legs visible through the smoke in a reclined position on the furniture," according to a life-saving award he won.

The person was asleep and unaware of the fire. Kostohryz radioed dispatch and escorted the resident to safety.

On Feb. 18, 2012, he was the first to respond to a call at a railroad bridge. A woman called dispatch and threatened to jump onto the street below. Before she could climb over the safety rail, Kostohryz intervened by restraining her and getting her to a medical facility for treatment.

One day in 2013, an officer arrived at a scene before medical professionals and assumed CPR responsibilities for an adult man. He requested a defibrillator, and Kostohryz arrived and administered the shock, and assisted with compressions. The medical team arrived and took over, and the man's life was saved.

Kostohryz also has been honored for being a leader in drunken driving arrests and showing teenagers the perils of driving while impaired.

His nomination came with letters of recommendation from the Moorhead police chief, Clay County sheriff, Moorhead superintendent, MSU-Moorhead director of public safety, and Moorhead High School principal.
