### THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

What do you get when you cross an insect with the Easter Bunny?

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internment/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 through 31 October 2023.

There are 207 urns in the Columbarium, 451 urns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 197 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 882 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 696 VETERANS AND 186 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 882. AND THERE ARE 92 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army - 371, Navy - 144, US Marine Corps - 49, US Air Force -128, ARMY/AF - 4, Spouses - 186, for a total of <u>882</u> internments/burial.

Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 20222 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,355. Since 13 October 2019 thru 31 October 2023, we have accumulated 12,161 donated volunteer hours.

Fargo VA Stand Down Report

This is a yearly event striving to engage with new and known homeless Veterans in our area to connect them with various shelter and housing options, services, and resources within the VA

as well as the community. Date/Time: 11/15/2023 from 10 am-2 pm Location: Fargo, VA CRRC. Overall, a successful event, with many providers working together to help get our homelessness numbers down on both sides of the river. It truly takes all community service providers and teamwork to end homelessness. These efforts will continue to flourish as the numbers are going down to the end result of no more homeless veterans in our community.

Number of Fargo VA staff working the event: 38

14 VA Homeless Program staff, 2 HPACT, 1 VA staff from SATP, 3 Whole Health, 3 VA Regional office, 1 VA Voc. Rehab, & 14 community providers to include staff from ND Job Service, Cass County VSO, Clay County VSO, MAC-V, SSVF, Veterans Inc., Community Options, Red Cross, Lalu Lash & Beauty, & ND Legal Services

Event coordinator: Fargo VA HCHV staff

Total number of Veterans attending the event:

Total Veterans: 45

Minority Veterans: 12

Female Veterans: 4

Total number of people attending the event: 83

Lalu Lash & Beauty provided 20 free haircuts to our Veterans during the event. Fargo Mat Bus provided free rides to the clinic for Veterans to attend the Stand Down. The CRRC HPACT team met with Veterans during the event to administer 1 flu and 1 COVID vaccination. 3 Blood Pressure checks were administered by HPACT nursing. 6

Veterans received Battlefield acupuncture at the event. Veterans received various giveaways at the event to include med trays and other Suicide Prevention items, and outdoor/winter gear to include hats, gloves, long underwear, tops, pants, and socks. The Red Cross donated hygiene and first aid bags as well as blankets at the event.

Veterans in attendance were provided with lunch as well by the VFW Aux Post 7564 of West Fargo. 1 Veteran was newly assigned to HPACT and 1 consult was placed for mental health therapy. 1 Veteran was applied for and was accepted to grant and per diem program.

Armstrong Announces Service Academy Nominations

Nicolas Armendariz-Lotito, Grand Forks – US Air Force Academy - Nicolas is a 2023 graduate of Grand Forks Central High School and is currently attending the US Air Force Academy Preparatory School in Colorado. His high school extracurricular activities included wrestling, football, track and field, and Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps. He is a member of the National Honors Society and holds black belts in karate and kickboxing.

Ryaan Alshami, Grand Forks – U.S. Naval Academy - Ryaan is a senior at Grand Forks Central High School. His high school extracurricular activities include soccer, track and field, and captain of the swim team. He is a member of the National Honors Society. He served as a volunteer for Meals on Wheels, the Alzheimer's Walk Association, and the United Way Foundation.

Marc Steinberg, Fargo – US Military Academy - Marc is a senior at the Liberty University Online Academy and is a member of the Fargo South Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps, where he serves as a squadron support officer. He has participated in competitive cheer at North Dakota Elite for 10 years. He has volunteered at his church teaching children for eight years. The service academies other than the US Coast Guard Academy require a nomination from their US Representative, one of their US Senators, or the Vice President of the United States to attend. Armstrong has nominated these three individuals to the respective academies, and each academy admission board will determine final appointments.

PACTACT Updates

Since last August there have been over 1.2 million claims submitted in the US, totaling \$3.02 billion in benefits paid out to our veterans, dependents, and widows. North Dakota has paid out roughly \$9 million in benefits during this time with over 3000 Pact Act claims. Currently, ND has 1365 claims left to be decided for pact act claims. Special thanks to Clay County for their assistance and for assisting numerous veterans in meeting the deadline for Pact Act claims. We definitely cannot do this alone. We have a great partnership and that will continue into 2024 and beyond, helping veterans in need.

## VA SAVE - Training

SAVE TRAINING TO BE HELD AT MOORHEAD POST 21 ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 16 By Gary H. Olson

SAVE Training by the Fargo VA will be held at Moorhead American Legion Post 21 on Saturday, December 16, starting at 2:15 PM and ending at 3:45 PM. S.A.V.E. training will help you act with care and compassion if you encounter a Veteran who is in crisis or experiencing suicidal thoughts. The acronym S.A.V.E. helps you remember the important steps involved in suicide prevention:

- S: Signs of suicidal thinking should be recognized
- A: Ask the most important question of all -"Are you thinking of killing yourself?"
- V: Validate the Veteran's experience
- E: Encourage treatment and Expedite getting help

## **Color/Honor Guard**

In late October and November, the Honor Guard presented military honors for nine veterans: Leroy "Sam" Dauner, USAF Combat Medic Korea; Albert Knapper, Army in Germany and recalled in 1961 for the Cuban missile crisis; Charles Green, Army 1955 to57; Clinton Sorenson, Army 1950s; Ralph Nordick, Army MP in Austria: David Flaten, Army mechanic, drove a tank and was a sharpshooter during the Korea war; Eugene Huber, USAF 1953 to 57; Dennis Wamre, Army officer at Fort Lewis Washington; and Leonard Schook, Army radio operator.

The Color Guard Presented the Colors twice in November, both on November 10, in honor of Veterans Day. The first was at the Dilworth, Glyndon, Felton Elementary School in Dilworth, where several hundred students and family members heard from local veterans and sang in honor of veterans. The second presentation was at Eventide Linden, where we presented the colors, described the funeral Honor ceremony, and displayed the electronic bugle and M1 Garand rifle. We also recounted memories of the Honor Flights for veterans and how they could apply if they had not attended one yet.

For several months, I have been asking for new individuals to join the Honor/Color Guard. I have had no one come forward to Join us in this important duty of honoring our fellow veterans and comforting their survivors. At a full honors ceremony, the rifle detail has M1 Garand rifles that we use to fire three shots each before taps are played, and the flag is folded and provided to the veteran's family.

The Post provides the uniforms we wear and a stipend of \$30 per event you participate in.

I will be asking SAL and FM Legion Riders if they would join the Honor/Color Guard as needed after their timely participation in two parades in September.

As the Honor/Color Guard Commander, I coordinate with the Honor Guard/Color Guard members to determine who is available for any single event, which normally occurs between 10 AM and 4 PM with an occasional evening event.


