

FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE It's DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

For the month of NOVEMBER, we had 10 internments/burials, 6 VETERANS, AND 4 SPOUSES. THE LAST INTERNMENT FOR A VETERAN WAS ON 15 NOVEMBER 2022.

There are 159 urns in the Columbarium, 365rns in the ground, 23 caskets in the private vaults, 164 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall. WE HAVE 569 VETERANS AND 142 SPOUSES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, FOR A TOTAL OF 713 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS. THIS INCLUDES THE 75 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE break down per branch of service is: Army – 313, Navy – 110, Marine Corps – 40, us Air Force -109 and Spouses – 141, for a total of 713 internments/burials

WE HAVE DONATED 130 VOLUNTEER HOURS FOR NOVEMBER 2022. OUR YEARLY VOLUNTEER HOURS ARE – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,776. Since 13 October 2019 thru 30 NOVEMBER 2022, WE HAVE ACCUMULATED 9,784 DONATED VOLUNTEER HOURS.

THERE HAVE BEEN MANY VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA, LOCAL CHURCHES, AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILL NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

I WILL HAVE AN UPDATE ON THE REMODELING OF THE SHELTER AND A PICTURE OF THE WIND-WALLS NEXT MONTH.

I LOVE THE SMELL OF FRESHLY BREWED COFFEE IN THE MORNING. AND I LOVE THE SOUND OF NO ONE TALKING TO ME WHILE I DRINK IT.



The new year is here, and with it comes those pesky resolutions and open enrollment for a couple of VA programs. Here's a couple of things that could jump-start your new year and bring some things in perspective. As always, please feel free to reach out to me with any questions, comments, or concerns. A special thanks to the Legion Riders for supporting our homeless veterans with a quality Christmas meal and gift.

- 1. Acknowledge the fact of your own mortality, and then start structuring your life in a more meaningful way.
- 2. Your material wealth will not make you a better or happier person.
- 3. Your obsession with finding happiness is what prevents its attainment.

Happiness is always present in your life--it is just a matter of connecting to it and allowing it to flow through you, that is challenging.

4. Donating money does less than donating time.

Giving your time is a way to change your perception and create a memory for yourself and others that will last forever.

- 5. You cannot make everyone happy, and if you try, you will lose yourself.
- 6. Your achievements and successes will not matter on your deathbed.

VA Health Care Open Enrollment: As part of the PACT Act, VA has expanded health care eligibility for certain veterans who were discharged after Sept. 11, 2001, and before Oct. 1, 2013. A one-year open enrollment period began on Oct. 1, 2022, for this group of veterans, depending on their dates and locations of service, regardless of disability claim status. Once the open enrollment period has closed, veterans from this group will be eligible for VA health care as part of a phase-in process, depending on discharge date.

VA Life Insurance policies have been serving our nation's Veterans, service members, and their families for over 100 years. Starting January 1, 2023, enrollment opens for Veterans Affairs Life Insurance (VALife)—a new program offering increased access for Veterans age 80 or under with any level of service-connected disability (0-100%).

Life insurance is a key component for future financial planning. With the right policy and coverage amount, life insurance can cover end-of-life costs, provide an inheritance to family, serve as income to a spouse, or cover some outstanding debts.

Those currently enrolled in VA's current policy for service-connected Veterans, Service-Disabled Veterans Life Insurance (S-DVI), may keep their coverage or switch to VALife. Although S-DVI will be closed to new enrollments after December 31, 2022.
