

FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been four years since we started doing internment/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 30 NOVEMBER 2023.

HOW DO YOU MAKE AN EGG LAUGH?

There are 210 urns in the Columbarium, 455 urns in the ground, 25 caskets in the private vaults, 199 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 891 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 704 VETERANS AND 187 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 891. THERE ARE 92 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is: Army - 374, Navy - 145, US Marine Corps -50, US Air Force -131, ARMY/AF - 4, Spouses -187, for a total of 891 internments/burial.

Our yearly volunteer hours are -2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 20222 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,454. From 13 October 2019 thru 31 October 2023, we have accumulated 11,663 donated volunteer hours.

Color/Honor Guard

Since my December news article, the Honor Guard again presented military honors for nine veterans: Stacy Perkins, Marine; Kenneth Schwartz, Army; Henry Lundberg, Amry National Guard, and Air National Guard; Chris Myrold, Army, and retired Army National Guard; Clifford Walstad, Air National Guard; Mary Conway, Army; Myron Hagene, Army; Thomas Pavola, Army Reserve; William "Joe" Dickason, Army.

The Color Guard had no activities that it was involved in.

The Honor/Color Guard still needs Legion members, FM Legion Riders, and Sons of the American Legion members to come forward to Join us in this important duty of honoring our fellow veterans and comforting their survivors. At a full honors ceremony, the rifle detail has M1 Garand rifles that we use to fire three shots each before taps are played, and the flag is folded and provided to the veteran's family.

The Post provides the uniforms we wear and provides a stipend of \$30 per event that you participate in.

As the Honor/Color Guard Commander, I coordinate with the Honor Guard/Color Guard members to determine who is available for any single event, which normally occurs between 10 AM and 4 PM with an occasional evening event.

Shooting Sports

I would like to explain more about your Post-21 shooting sports programs.

First in the archery program. We have supported this for a number of years; in the beginning, we supported Lake Agassiz Bowmen with money to help with their basic archery education for their coed youth program. Later, the LAB program was taken over by the Fargo Parks Dept. At that time, Post-21 dropped its support. A few years later, we again began to support the LAB with funds to help support their CO-ED youth and CUB program. Our support goes to help supply 3-D animal targets. These targets are used by youth ages 5-15 in practice and competition.

As in any shooting sport, SAFETY is a top requirement. It begins in the basic education classes with certified archery instructors. Safety continues on the shooting lines. There is always a range Captain in charge of the range and all shooters. The range Captain addresses all safety issues. He controls when the youth can shoot and when to pull arrows. Depending on the number of shooters, a safety officer or Captain will be on the shooting line.



As the new year is upon us, please be mindful of those that are hurting in our area, either from loss, mental illness, or disease. Let's try to help those in need and set an obtainable resolution for oneself. There are so many opportunities in the F-M Area to volunteer at or work with a population of people that need more advocacy.

Sharing on behalf of the Fargo National Cemetery Committee

Over 250 people gathered today at the Fargo National Cemetery for the annual Wreaths Across America.

This year's event was coordinated by the 119 Civil Air Patrol. We were blessed with what one would call 'great weather' for a mid-December day with wonderful family, friends, and volunteers to lay wreaths on every headstone in the cemetery and those who served in our neighboring cemetery at Maple Sheyenne Lutheran Church. Thank you to all who came, who purchased and laid wreaths, and coordinated a lovely event.

In the spirit of giving, please consider the Cass and Clay GAP FUND

This fund assists Veterans in very urgent need or under extreme circumstances or emergencies when no other option is readily available.

This fund has been sanctioned by both county commissions and is held and maintained by the Fargo-Moorhead Area Foundation. No other counties have a fund like this. Veterans Service Officers from both Cass and Clay Counties provide oversight on eligibility and referral, working with the Foundation to issue gift cards, motel payments, and other forms of payments that will provide short-term assistance to Veterans while they pursue longer-term solutions.

The Fund assists veterans within our community that have fallen into very difficult times and are homeless, facing eviction and are imminently homeless, or are undergoing a crisis or severe hardship and are finding doors closed to them at every turn.

Federal and state programs are available for veterans; however, there are gaps created by residency requirements and other issues that often leave our veterans without basic support. The program is "once-in-a-lifetime," so Cass/Clay Veterans Service Officers carefully weigh the need and determine if other services would be a better option.
