The National office sent out reminder dues notices in February to those members who have not yet renewed for 2026. FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY March 2026



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019, Thru 31 JANUARY 2026.

There are 335 urns in the Columbarium, 688 urns in the ground, 31 caskets in the private vaults, 315 caskets in the Government vaults and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, for a total of 1,353.

THE INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, INCLUDE 1,078 VETERANS AND 293 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,371. THERE ARE 159 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY

The break down per branch of service is: Army – 549, Navy – 228, US Marine Corps – 72, US Air Force – 225, ARMY-Air Force – 4, Spouses – 293, for a total of 1,371, Internments/burial.

During the month of JANUARY, the Fargo memorial Honor Guard conducted 11 Interment/Burials for 86 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021=3,373, 2022=2,798, 2023=2,557, 2024 = 2,889 and 2025 = 2,977, 2026 = 86. Since 13 October 2019 thru 31 JANUARY 2026, we have accumulated 17,720, donated volunteer hours.

THERE HAS BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

The VA introduced a rule called Evaluative Rating: Impact of Medication that many veterans believed could negatively affect disability ratings. Veterans spoke up. We organized. We pushed back.

Now, Secretary Collins has announced that the VA is halting enforcement of the rule effective immediately. While the VA says the rule was meant to clarify policy, they acknowledged veterans' concerns and confirmed it will not be enforced going forward.


This is proof of something important: when veterans stand together, we create change.

Shooting Sports

This month I will write about our support of the CO-ED archery program. Your Post-21 supports CO-ED youth through the Lake Agassiz Bowmen Archery Club. We have supported archery through this Club for many years. In the beginning we supported their Archery Education program. This was called the JOAD, (Junior Olympic Archery Development) When the city of Fargo Parks took over that program, we supported the Lake Agassiz Bowmen by helping buy 3-D targets for CO-ED juniors and novice archers. The targets are used in archery tournaments in the youth and novice section. These targets are set at 3-10 yards.

The next archer shoot will be held in March at the West Fargo High School Gym. Shooters come from MN, ND, SD and Canada to compete. Many shooters bring their families who spend the day shooting, watching family shoot and spend time with the kids, who are probably shooting too. The youth and novice shoot at the same time as the adults.

As always, SAFETY IS #1. All the shooters are controlled by a Range Officer. There will be a P.A. system to control the shooting line. The commands will be "THE TARGETS ARE CLEAR GO AHEAD AND SHOOT". When All archers have sot 2 arrows and have moved back off the shooting line, the Range Officer Will announce, "Pull Arrows" When all arrows are pulled, the Range Officer will start again with his command targets are clear, go ahead and shoot.

The bow club members control the shooting line, walk with the shooters to pull arrows, score arrows, advise shooters at all times.

So as always, SAFETY IS #1.
