May greetings!

May is an important month for the American Legion Auxiliary. It is Poppy Month! Poppy distribution is an important part of our mission and tradition. I am going to spend some time describing the history of the poppy and the American Legion Auxiliary, taken from the American Legion Auxiliary Unit Guide.

In the spring of 1919, amidst The Craft and Vendor Show on April complete devastation, poppies bloomed in abundance on the battlefields of France, where so many men had fallen in battle. A replica of these poppies has become the memorial flower of the American Legion Family. The American Legion was the first national organization to adopt the poppy as its memorial flower at its National Convention in Cleveland in 1920. To protect the memorial poppy from commercialism, the American Legion Auxiliary adopted a national poppy program at the St. Paul Convention in 1924. The Auxiliary adopted the poppy as its memorial flower in 1921. When it adopted the poppy, the Auxiliary pledged 100 percent of profits from poppy distribution to welfare relief for servicemembers and their families, thus fulfilling the true meaning of the poppy: an emblem of faith, faith which is being kept with all who died through service to the living. John McCrea wrote the poem In Flanders Fields in 1915, which inspired the use of the poppy as a symbol of remembrance. Over 1000 Americans gave their lives in the final offensive to liberate Belgium. Nearly 370 Americans are buried here in Waregem, West Flanders, Belgium. It is now a peaceful site providing a garden for quiet contemplation.

In keeping with Poppy Month, our Unit will be distributing poppies and memorial cards of remembrance at our Legion Post. The memorial cards will each be displayed on the wall of our Post 21. Please keep in mind the meaning of the poppy as you donate to the American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Fund. The funds from poppy donations will continue to be used for the welfare of veterans, active military personnel, and their families.

Once again, our dedicated Auxiliary members made poppies for the Minnesota State Department at our April meeting! We will continue this project until we reach our goal of 1000 poppies! Let's meet again at 5:00 before our May meeting and keep the project going. Our May meeting is at 6:00 on May 1st. You are all invited to attend!

1st was once again a huge success. A giant thank you to Judy and Kristi for organizing the event and also to our members that helped set up and work at the show. Also, a big thank you to the Post members that helped set up tables early in the morning! A thank you also goes out to our members that helped serve coffee and cookies at the PreFlight for the Honor Flight this past month. The Auxiliary is also helping serve the weekly Thursday night dinner at the Post. We will discuss this more in-depth at our May meeting. The Honor Flight returns on May 2nd, and we would like to see our members at the airport waving flags to welcome the Veterans back home. The time will be given at our next meeting. If you haven't had this experience of welcoming our Veterans from returning from their "Trip of a Lifetime," it is a very emotional experience and one to remember for what our mission stands for.

This a reminder that our Unit is ordering very nice sweatshirts with the poppy logo and Unit 21 embroidered on them. The price is \$40 and \$42 for 2x and 3x sizes. Please put your order in at our next meeting if you haven't done so already.


Poppy



The Poppy Program is one of our most known programs in The American Legion Auxiliary. Adopted in 1921 by the American Legion Auxiliary, the Poppy Program was started in 1924. Since then, our special red poppy program has been synonymous with The American Legion Auxiliary. Although distributed and worn around Memorial Day and Veterans Day, there are many ways to wear and use the poppy all year around. The making of our poppy is done by Veterans, and they are paid by the American Legion Auxiliary.

The poppies are NEVER SOLD; they are distributed. They are offered to anyone whether they give a donation or not. The poppy has been pinned on jackets, labels, hats, and other clothing items to honor the sacrifices of the men and women who served. Other ways to promote the poppy are Miss Poppy contests, Poppy gardens, Poppy Poster contests, and poppy craft projects. The poppy symbol may be used in non-traditional displays: think centerpieces, corsages, hats, buttons, balloons, stickers, temporary tattoos, t-shirts, cookies, cupcakes, wreaths, Christmas decorations, note cards- all fun ways to promote our poppy.

FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD VA NATIONAL CEMETERY

THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE It's DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

For the month of MARCH, we had 14 internments/burials, 4 Urns in LOT # 2 (GROUND) AND 4 Urns IN THE – CCA (COLUMBARIUM), AND 6 CASKETS IN LOT # 5.

There are 167 urns in the Columbarium, 371 urns in the ground, 26 caskets in the private vaults, 177 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall. WE HAVE 594 VETERANS AND 149 SPOUSES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY, FOR A TOTALOF 743 INTERNMENT/BURIALS. THIS INCLUDES THE 79 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE break down per branch of service is: Army – 324 Navy – 115, Marine Corps – 43, US Air Force -108, USAAF - 4, and Spouses – 149, for a total of 743 internments/burials

WE HAVE DONATED 263 VOLUNTEER HOURS FOR MARCH 2023. OUR YEARLY VOLUNTEER HOURS ARE – 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 483. From 13 October 2019 thru 31 MARCH 2023, WE HAVE ACCUMULATED 10,289 DONATED VOLUNTEER HOURS.

UNCLAIMED VETERANS: I will have a complete report in the June issue of the Post 21 Newsletter. We have close to ten unclaimed Veterans since we opened in September of 2019.



A second ceremony on Apr. 30 will feature keynote speaker Maynard Kaderlik, a Vietnam veteran knowledgeable on Agent Orange and the PCAT Act, a live musical performance by the Red River Valley Veterans Concert Band, and more. Additionally, the Vietnam Memorial Wall, the Canadian Vietnam Memorial Wall, various aircraft, and military vehicles will be on display during the week. Both CVSO's are planning to speak Sunday, Apr. 30, around 1400 to wrap up the day's events. The week of events is free and open to the public.

Rebuilding Trust

Veterans Affairs Secretary Denis McDonough said that a lack of trust in the Department of Veterans Affairs remains a key obstacle preventing veterans from filing benefit claims, including for benefits covered under the new PACT Act, "There's just a general lack of trust issue in VA," McDonough conceded at last week's War Horse Symposium, a forum that discussed issues related to service members and veterans. The Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics or PACT Act was named after an Ohio Army National Guard soldier who served in Iraq and Kosovo. Robinson died in 2020 from toxic exposure resulting from his military service. McDonough said that as of last week, 450,000 out of roughly 5.3 million individuals eligible to file claims under the PACT Act had done so. According to the VA, however, more than 2.5 million toxic exposure screenings have been conducted as of Mar. 20. McDonough said that he sees the 450,000 who have signed up since last August as a small number compared to the more than 5 million eligible beneficiaries. "Trust is a hard thing to gain but an easy thing to lose," he responded when asked why the number isn't larger. McDonough added that some veterans may be reluctant to enroll in VA health care or claim benefits because of previous bad experiences. Another reason, McDonough suggested, is that veterans may have received misleading information. The PACT Act was signed into law Aug. 10, 2022, a total of 172,515 PACT Act-related claims from veterans and survivors have been completed through March 18. The lag in processing claims reflects major recruiting and retention issues facing both the Veterans Health Administration and the Veterans Benefits Administration. The VA is conducting a comprehensive, targeted effort to reach veterans and survivors so that they apply for PACT Actrelated care and benefits immediately. The agency has hosted more than 125 PACT Act "Week of Action" events in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. During these events, the VA completed 5,600 toxic exposure screenings and received 2,600 claims for benefits. McDonough also highlighted mistrust in the VA as a primary challenge during his 2021 confirmation hearing. Last November, he told Military Times that "one of the big issues with VA is to make sure that the vets trust us." Written by Jennifer Hickey

Possible changes to Dental on the horizon...

Rep. Gus Bilirakis has co-signed a bill that would expand dental care coverage for veterans with certain chronic health conditions. Bilirakis and California Congressman Mike Levin of California reintroduced the Veterans Early Treatment for Chronic Ailment Resurgence through Examinations (VET CARE) Act. It would require the Veterans Administration (VA) to put in place a four-year pilot program providing dental care for veterans with certain chronic health conditions. Right now, dental care through the VA is limited to those who are 100 percent disabled or have a direct service-connected injury. Studies have shown that regular dental care helps alleviate certain chronic conditions, reducing overall healthcare costs. Since the VA spends most of its healthcare costs on treating veterans with chronic ailments, like diabetes and heart conditions, increasing access to preventative dental services would help ensure a healthier Veteran population and bring those costs down, according to a Bilirakis press release. "Our veterans have sacrificed so much on behalf of our country; they deserve access to high-quality healthcare – and that includes dental care," Bilirakis said. "The VET CARE Act will get the ball rolling to expand access to dental care for our nation's heroes and could result in lower overall health care costs for the VA. Citrus County has more than 20,000 veterans. "Not only is this legislation good for veterans, but it is also good for the VA as a whole," Bilirakis added. Bilirakis represents Citrus, Hernando, and Pasco counties in the 12th Congressional District,
