## FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

For the month of SEPTEMBER, we had 16 internments/burials, 10 Urns in LOT # 2 (GROUND), 4 Urns IN THE – CCA (COLUMBARIUM), AND 2 CASKETS IN LOT # 5.

There are 200 urns in the Columbarium, 439 urns in the ground, 26 caskets in the private vaults, 195 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 862 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 684 VETERANS AND 178 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 862. AND THERE ARE 90 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of and service is: Army – 364, Navy – 140, US Marine Corps – 48, US Air Force -128, ARMY/AF –4, Spouses – 178, for a total of 862 internments/burial.

#### Happy Halloween,

This last month has been going by fast, and our office had our bi-annual state training in Mandan, ND, a few weeks ago. We all remain accredited and ready to assist our veterans going forward into the new year. At this specific training, the North Dakota Department of Veteran Affairs did give all participating counties Vietnam coins to thank our veterans for serving and offer a small token for their larger individual sacrifices when home. A "Welcome Home" coin was made, and our office has roughly 100 coins to give to those residing in Cass County. Quantities are very limited. 1 per veteran.

As the weather changes from summer to fall, the Community Resource and Referral clinic will be having a homeless veteran standdown on Nov 15th from 1000-1400. There will be legal services, housing resources, employability specialists, VA screening, claims assistance, health screenings, and free haircuts. #### 2024 Pay Raises for Vets and Retirees

Disabled veterans will also have their benefit payments increase in the upcoming year. VA disability checks will go up about \$5.31 per month for those with a 10% rating and \$115.90 for those rated at 100% who don't have dependents. Military retirees and disabled veterans will see their monthly checks increase by 3.2% for 2024, thanks to the annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) due to inflation. While 3.2% may look low compared to the 2022 (5.9%) and 2023 (8.7%) adjustments, it's still above the average of 2.6% for the prior 20 years.

## **Color/Honor Guard**

EARLY BIRD

In October, the Honor Guard presented military honors for only one individual: Eugene Christensen, US Army in the early 1950s, serving in West Germany as a driver and radioman.

The Color Guard was not active in October, but we are planning an event for the veterans at Eventide Linden on Nov. 10.

The refurbished M1s had a teak oil finish applied in October and have been properly lubed. A successful test firing was also performed.

For several months, I have been asking for new individuals to join the Honor/Color Guard. I have had no one come forward to Join us in this important duty of honoring our fellow veterans and comforting their survivors. At a full honors ceremony, the rifle detail has M1 Garand rifles that we use to fire three shots each before taps are played, and the flag is folded and provided to the veteran's family.

The Post provides the uniforms we wear and provides a stipend of \$30 per event that you participate in.
