




Welcome back, Auxiliary members!

# FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE It'S DEDICATION ON SEPTEMBER 7, 2019.

For JULY, we had 22 internments/burials, 12 Urns in LOT #2 (GROUND) AND 5 Urns IN THE – CCA (COLUMNBARIUM) AND 5 CASKES IN LOT #5.

What do you get when you cross an insect with an Easter Bunny?

There are 188 urns in the Columbarium, 420 urns in the ground, 26 caskets in the private vaults, 188 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 824 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 655 VETERANS AND 169 POUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 824. AND THERE ARE 86 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is Army – 352, Navy – 133, Marine Corps – 47, US Air Force -119, USAF - 4, and Spouses – 169, for 824 internments/burials.

THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAD THE HONOR OF SERVING AS PALLBEARERS AT JOHN'S FUNERAL SERVICE ON AUGUST 12 IN ULEN, MN.

#### John's Obituary

John L. Opgrand, a man of strength and charm, embarked on his life journey on April 3, 1917, as the fifth of sixteen children born to Anton and Gida (Eina) Opgrand in Hitterdal, Minnesota. Raised in the charming town of Ulen, John's vibrant spirit and athletic skill shone through during his high school years, endearing him to all his friends and family, who cherished his humorous nature.

John's destiny took a patriotic turn when, on October 27, 1939, he answered the call to serve his country, enlisting in the US Army Air Corps. As a Private First-Class in the US Army Air Corp, he proudly served with the 19th Squadron, 20th Air Base Group. Remarkably, John was part of a true family legacy of service, as four of his brothers were serving their country at the same time during World War II.

In a fateful chapter of his military service, John was sent to the Philippines, where he displayed unwavering bravery and dedication to his duty. However, the uncertainties of war would cast their shadow upon him as he was captured and became a prisoner of war. He was part of the Bataan Death March, which he survived. He was later confined in the Cabanatuan POW camp in the Province of Nueva Ecija, Luzon Island, in the Philippine Islands.

Tragically, on June 10, 1942, John died as a POW, marking the end of a young life full of promise. His selfless sacrifice did not go unnoticed, as the nation postburnously honored him with an array of distinguished awards, including the Bronze Star Medal, the Purple Heart, the Prisoner of War Medal, and the Army Good Conduct Medal, among others.

Though John's physical presence may have been lost, his name is eternally inscribed on the Wall of the Missing at the Manila American Cemetery in Taguig City, Philippines. He stands among countless American heroes who bravely faced the unknown, their resting places forever elusive. His sacrifice is a testament to our armed forces' unyielding commitment and a symbol of our nation's resilience.

John's legacy continues through his cousins, nieces, and nephews, many of whom live in the region having ties to the Ada, Ulen, Hitterdal, and Twin Valley communities.

A memorial service will be held Saturday, August 12, 2023, at 10:00 am at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Uten, MN, to celebrate and honor the life of John Opgrand – a true American patriot who selflessly served his country with unwavering dedication. All those who wish to pay their respects are welcome to attend. ## **Veterans Service Officer**

The summer is flying by, and with that comes back to school and fall sports. Also, open enrollment for as part of the PACT Act, VA has expanded health care eligibility for certain veterans who were discharged after Sept. 11, 2001, and before Oct. 1, 2013. A one-year open enrollment period began on Oct. 1, 2022, and will end on Sept. 30, 2023, for this group of veterans, depending on their dates and locations of service, regardless of disability claim status. Once the open enrollment period has closed, veterans from this group will be eligible for VA health care as part of a phase-in process based on the discharge date. Don't wait until Sept. 30. Apply for your health care today.



Operation Check Six Honor Fest on August 26, 2023. Check Operation Six is a nonprofit organization that is Promoting Healing of Trauma Survivors Through the Arts and Entertainment. You can either attend in person or watch online on Facebook, as it will be streamed live. I've noticed they aren't on the NDDVA website anymore. I found them when I first started this job, and they've been building a good group of Veterans, and alongside with the Fargo VA. I went to this event last year, and it was a great time for Veterans and their families, also networked with people who work for the VA. If you have Veterans who like this kind of thing, make sure to implement it into your interview process, asking what their hobbies are. Sometimes, Veterans need a different route, and this is one option. Eagle's Healing Nest-Great resource out there for veterans in need of additional support

We are a nonprofit organization headquartered in Sauk Centre, MN. We primarily provide residence housing and programming for individuals who are suffering from addiction, PTSD, and other issues that stem from trauma and invisible wounds of war. The type of living experience we provide is centered around the 5 pillars of recovery and peer-to-peer programming. We have found the peer-to-peer model to be extremely helpful within the veteran community. The neat thing about The Nest is that all of our programming was built around the needs of the residents and veterans - everyone heals differently, and our facilities reflect that by providing a multitude of healing services, programs & activities. Some of those include the following: - Individual counseling & group therapy, Accelerated Resolution Therapy, Recovery Support Programs (AVP, AA, NA, etc) - Partner programs & training that include the trades & and continuing education - A variety of health & wellness services (equine therapy, service dog training, massage therapy, etc) - An onsite art studio, music studio, rock shop & woodshop We also facilitate and partner with other organizations to include many onsite & offsite activities, outings & retreats throughout the year such as: - Veteran fishing trips - Turkey hunting - Wellness retreats - Nest program outings (sports events, concerts, holiday events, etc) In addition to all of that, we also have a sister facility located in Redwood Falls, MN. This facility is a little bit different from our Sauk Centre location - Eagle's Healing Nest in Redwood Falls is considered a next step for anyone who has completed their programming at EHN in Sauk Centre (or elsewhere), who is looking for a sober living residence and additional support. 



























## **Color/Honor Guard**

In August, the Honor Guard presented military honors for the following individuals: Jeremy Jensen, US Army 1966-69; John Opgrand, US Army Air Corps, Philippines, Died in a Japanese prison camp in 1942; Lloyd Manly, US Army, Germany during the Berlin Air Lift: and Mike Lockhart.

The Color Guard was not involved with any activities. I will represent the Post at the Sept.1st, 10:00 AM parade at the Rollag Steam Threshers reunion, along with the FM Legion Riders and the SAL.

For several months, I have been asking for new individuals to join the Honor/Color Guard. I have had no one come forward to Join us in this important duty of honoring our fellow veterans and comforting their survivors. At a full honors ceremony, the rifle detail has M1 Garand rifles that we use to fire three shots each before taps are played, and the flag is folded and provided to the veteran's family.

We also are the face of Post 21 at parades and other events where we present the colors. Parades are where we need younger legionnaires.

The Post provides the uniforms we wear and a stipend of \$30 per event you participate in.

As the Honor/Color Guard Commander, I coordinate with the Honor Guard/Color Guard members to determine who is available for any single event, which normally occurs between 10 AM and 4 PM with an occasional evening event.
